Building Setbacks

What are the Requirements for the Distance between a Home and Property Line

It all depends on the zone you live in. All zones have setbacks from neighboring properties and roads. Some multi-family units do have zero lot lines between like units.

If you live in a Mountain Home Development or Senior Development, you will need to review your plat map of your specific development since setbacks in these developments are based on the approved plan and can vary. Also, for accessory structures, see the handout for Accessory Structures.

Please note, the property line at the street is not at the curb or road for front yard setbacks. The city owns the road right-of-way for areas with curb that can extend into your yard 9 to 10 feet. In areas without curb, this area can be up to 14 to 20 feet. To know what area the city owns, please refer to your plat map or call the city.

The following table shows each zone and its required setbacks:
