This year we'd love to see even more of you as we will hold the event on Tuesday, August 3, 2010 as an early part of our Lindon Days Celebration. On this special night, communities across America come together to make a statement that as a united community and Nation, we will all commit to work together to identify issues that affect our public safety. Our theme this year is "Not in Our Town!" We hope that could mean No Drugs, No Crime, and No Criminals. Not in Lindon City!

On that night there will be block parties and community events with City Officials and Officers from the police and fire services in your neighborhood park to meet with you and discuss what concerns YOU about safety and crime prevention in your neighborhood. Following the neighborhood gatherings we hope that you will join us in "Flashlight Walks" throughout the city to identify potential issues and to point out crime prevention tips. Join us as together we demonstrate our love for this community and our dedication to protecting it.

The National Night Out is designed with several goals in mind; To heighten crime and drug prevention awareness and to generate greater support and participation from the community in local crime prevention efforts.
