If events in life prevent you from attending the drill, please mention to a neighbor who will attend where you are going to be. In a real emergency, obviously people will be out of town or just away from home. In a real life event, it would be vital to emergency resources to know that we don't have to look for you in a collapsed home....because your whole family is happily on a cruise ship in Mexico! Communications will again be the major test of the drill, with more complexity added in, just on the city official side of things! We are again going to perform emergency drills with all of the schools that day, and we are including every Lindon business that wishes to be involved, as they also need to be prepared to respond and recover. Please take the time to attend the City Primary Election which will be held on Tuesday September 13<sup>th</sup>. We have nine dedicated candidates who have bravely committed to run for city office and they all deserve our support.
