## **PROVIDENCE CITY ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

↳ **PARK RESERVATIONS:** Zollinger and Von Baer Park may now be reserved. Parks can be reserved for the months of May through September 2011. Reservations are given on a first come first served basis. For fee and park questions, call 752-9441 ext. 22.

↳ **SNOW REMOVAL:** Just a reminder from our Public Works Department, to please make sure...

- ▶ You keep the sidewalks clear of snow.
- ▶ Don't push snow from your property out into the street.
- ▶ Remove your garbage and recycling cans from the street as soon as possible.

Residents should be aware that snow plows frequently may be operating in directions contrary to the normal flow of traffic. For everyone's safety, please use caution when in the vicinity of a snowplow. Please, as you drive, take enough time to slow down and be able to stop, and for you and your car's safety, remain at least 150 feet behind snowplows.

*Please give them room to work!*

↳ **SAFETY CONCERNS:** When picking up students after school at Providence Elementary, please do not double-park on the east side of the building. There is a great deal of student traffic in this area and we worry this congestion may be a potential hazard. Also, remember U-Turns are not allowed in this area either.

↳ **BASEBALL / SOFTBALL REGISTRATION:** It's hard to believe, but baseball and softball season is just around the corner. We have once again extended our registration. Registration will run from February 14, 2011 until March 24, 2011. **We will not be taking late registrations** again this year so we are able to meet uniform ordering deadlines. ## **BUSINESS LICENSES: NOW DUE!!!**

Business licenses are now due. You have until January 31 before late fees are applied. If you are running a business in Providence you must obtain a business license through the city office. Please contact Terri W. at 752-9441 ext. 14 for more information.

## **DOG LICENSES: NOW DUE!!!**

All dogs (big, small, indoor, outdoor) residing in Providence need to be licensed through the city. License renewals for 2011 are now available at the City Office, 15 South Main. **License fees did go up this year. Spayed or neutered dogs are now \$15.00 and NON-spayed or NON-neutered dogs are \$25.00.** Proof of your animal's rabies shot will need to be provided to the city, so make an appointment to get needed vaccinations before late fees are charged. Late fees will be charged after January 31, 2011.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE CACHE COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT ANIMAL CONTROL:**

There are times when it's important for you to do special things for your animal when it gets cold outside. All animals require very special care. The air is cold, it's windy, and water freezes.

Outside animals like dogs use more calories to keep warm in winter, so give your dog additional food. Fresh straw (not hay) can make a nice bed in the doghouse. It's comfortable and helps keep your dog warm. Many people who live in cold areas use this inside their dog houses.

Young puppies should not be left outside when it's very cold. They can't make themselves warm like older dogs can. Keep your puppy safe and cozy.

If you leave water outside, make sure that it does not become frozen. Your buddy needs regular, cool water to drink, not ice. You can't get much water from an ice-cube!

After your dog has been playing in the snow, check his feet. There may be snowballs stuck between the toes. If the hair on your dog's feet is long, the snowballs will stick to it. Snow can also build up on a dog's ears, tail, and belly. It forms little balls of very hard, icy snow and they can stick to the hair on your dog. They can be very cold and painful. Remember how your toes felt when you step in a bath tub with water after you have been outside in the cold! It is the same for an animal!

Make sure that liquids like car anti-freeze are put away in cupboards or high up on shelves where animals can't accidentally drink them. They're very poisonous!

Many people wonder where dogs, especially little ones, can go to the bathroom when there is deep snow. One thing you can do is to shovel the snow in an area that is big enough for your dog to do his business.

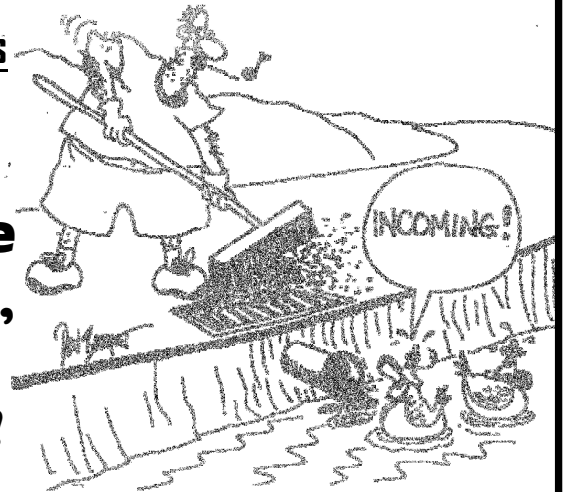
