**Sewer** -Administrative items are all that remain to be finalized for the Sewer project. A letter is being reviewed that will be sent to citizens outlining the procedure for obtaining a permit and connecting. A final version will be presented to the board for approval in January and then circulated.

**Farmland Subdivision** - A resolution was passed to mandate a plan of action that sets forth the Village's expectation and time line required for completion of the roadways and improvements deemed necessary for the Village to consider the Farmland Subdivision for proper dedication and acceptance. The roadways and improvements are to be completed no later than June 1, 2012.

#### Dear Citizens,

I am happy to announce that our entire sewer system piping is installed and has passed the necessary testing. The village board has administrative items to finalize at our January meeting to close out the sewer project. If everything goes as planned at our January meeting, we will be sending every homeowner a packet. This packet will contain:

- 1. A detailed cover letter outlining the necessary steps and telephone numbers to call
- 2. Details of sewer connection procedures
- 3. Answers to how each home can be connected to the sewer system
- 4. Sample sewer service diagrams
- 5. Construction requirements
- 6. Application paper work and utilities information

While thesewer system connection process is new to this village board and it's residents, it is not new to our engineers who have guided us through this multi-year and multi-million dollar project. They have prepared us well for the final step of this process and it will be outlined in the packet. I strongly encourage everyone to take time to thoroughly review the sewer packet that comes to them in early February 2012.

In the spring the village board will be developing a plan for some much needed upgrades to the Village Hall and Dooley Park. The expected projects will be great opportunities for community projects and community involvement. We will be seeking qualified volunteers that are interested in getting involved in their community for much needed improvements. We will share these plans as they are developed.

Reminder of the dates used by the billing department as required by

Chapter 12 of the Village of Downs Ordinances

1<sup>st</sup> of the month:

All accounts are charged for the prior month's service

15<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> of the month:

Meters are read

20<sup>th</sup> of the month:

All accounts are due in full from the billing sent on the 1st

21<sup>st</sup> of the month:

Late penalties are added and shut off notices are sent out.

26<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> of the month:

Shut offs will be done for non-payment

Shut-offs: Payments are to be paid at the Village Hall and not to the person turning the water off. Should your service be shut off, a turn on fee of \$30 is needed in addition to the outstanding balance. Service will not resume until the next business day that payment is posted.

Payments and NSF Checks: PAYMENTS NEED TO BE MADE USING THE VILLAGE PO BOX OR THE DROPBOX. VILLAGE EMPLOYEES ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR GETTING YOUR PAYMENT TO THE VILLAGE HALL. Those using on-line payment services need to be sure the service is sending the check in advance of the due date of the 20<sup>th</sup>. THE VILLAGE DOES NOT RECEIVE DIRECT TRANSFERS. NSF checks cost the customer and the Village. The Village is charged a fee by the bank for each NSF check. The Village charges the customers with an NSF check fee of \$25, and then re-payment by the customer needs to be done in cash.

**Water Emergencies** such as no water or water leaking need to be reported to Jeff Misch at 275-3793. The water trustee is Mike Freimann and he can be reached at 378-1538.

Hydrant Flushing will be December 13, 14, 15 from 9:00-12:00 noon. Evening flushing has been discontinued due to high water usage in the evenings.

Water Meters and Transmitters are the property of the Village of Downs. Please contact Village Hall for any maintenance needs. Tampering with this equipment is against Village of Downs Ordinances.

#### SEWER ITEMS

Loan Payments: For those wanting to apply additional payments to their BNWRD Fee Loan need to be sure and include a note with their payment so the payment can be applied correctly.

Sewer Connection: When property owners are allowed to connect to the sewer stem, please keep in mind that gutters and sump pumps are not permitted to drain into the system.

#### Sewer Update December 2011

The Village of Downs' engineering firm, Farnsworth Group, reported at December's Village Board meeting that construction of the multi-million dollar sewer system is complete. A few sections of pipe are being cleared of debris and portions of the existing pipe in the Mallard Point subdivision still need to be inspected by camera, but the system is essentially ready for use. The remaining work by contractors consists of restoration. Residents who believe additional restoration work is needed should contact the village hall.

Most of what remains before residents will be allowed to connect to the system is administrative work. This includes the following:

- Village Board will finalize the part of the sewer ordinance that will set the rates residents will pay for the sewer (expected to be passed at January 2012 meeting).
  - As previously mentioned, the rate will include a portion that all households in the village will be assessed for the cost of construction and operation and maintenance of the system. A property-based tax assessed by the Bloomington-Normal Water Reclamation District (BNWRD) may be added to water/sewer bills in January 2013\*.
    - The initial estimate of this portion of the fee for an average household is around \$22 per month, broken down as follows:
      - \$17 for payment of the zero-percent interest loan (\$5.7 million financed)
      - \$5 for operation, maintenance and repair
  - o The remaining portion of the monthly fee will be based on use:
    - \$4.88 on average assessed by the village for use
    - \$11.33 on average assessed by BNWRD for use
  - TOTAL ESTIMATED AVERAGE MONTHLY FEE FOR SEWER = \$35.21 (Actual fee may be higher or lower)
  - \*- A home with an assessed value of \$150,000 would see an additional tax of \$7 per month in 2013 for the BNWRD fee.
- The village will send a letter to residents telling them they may begin connecting to the system
  - o We anticipate this letter being sent by February 2012.
  - The letter will include an application for connection.
  - Residents will have approximately 180 days to connect (or provide proof that they are exempt from connection by virtue of a valid septic permit and no current connection to the system).

Homeowners are responsible for hiring a contractor to make the connection for their home to the provided stub into the sewer system.

- This cost is the responsibility of the homeowner.
- Final connection cannot be made unless inspected by a village representative.

Casali & Son's is starting a new single stream recycling program. Which means it is not necessary to separate your recyclables for collection. Starting on Feb 10<sup>th</sup> 2012. Your recycling day is now bi-weekly. It will be the 2nd & 4th Saturday of each month. Please make sure all containers containing recycling be clearly marked. Please do not over load cans or it won't be picked up.

#### RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING MATERIALS ACCEPTED

• Aluminum cans, trays & foil (trays & foil must be cleaned)

#### Steel cans and tins

- PET-soda, water, & flavored beverage bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin)
- HDPE-Milk & juice jugs (#2 clear plastic resin)
- HDPE-Detergent & fabric softener container (#2 colored plastic resin)
- PVC-Narrow neck containers only (#3 plastic resin) such as health &beauty aid products, household cleaners.
- LDPE-Grocery containers (#4 plastic resins) such as margarine tubs, frozen desert cups, six and twelve pack rings.
- PP-Grocery containers (#5 plastic resins) such as yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles.
- #7 Plastic resin narrow neck containers only.
- Plastic buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5 gallon size maximum)
- Glass bottles and jars (clear, brown, green) No window glass, dinnerware or ceramics.

#### Guidelines:

- All items should be empty of contents and rinsed thoroughly.
- Plastic (grocery) bags and garbage bags are <u>not accepted</u>. Recycling will not be picked up if these bags are used.

Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves)

Cardboard (no waxed cardboard) must be broken down and fit in your container.

Office, computer, notebook & gift wrap paper (no metal clips, spirals, binders)

Chipboard (cereal, cake & food mix boxes, gift boxes, etc.)

Carrier stock (soda & beer can carrying cases)

Junk mail & envelopes (no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps)

Paper back books (no hard cover books)
