From the Desk of the Mayor September 2014

This month the Board adopted the new Strategic Development Plan and revised Land Use Plan found in Chapter 18 of our Village Ordinances. We also signed a new agreement with a copier lease company that cut our term by 1 year, cut our payment over 50% and we will own the Canon copier after 3 years. Finally, we approved a 15 year franchise agreement at 1% with Mediacom locking in the \$500 community grant to our parks. The Board increase the percentage as it would more than likely would have been passed onto the residents.

Topics gathering conversation and rumors are the police situation, TIF and medical cannabis. I will attempt to cover these briefly. I encourage, as always, get the facts and please call a trustee or myself to talk about your feelings regarding these topics.

First, is the police situation. You will read the statement made by Maureen Roach, Police Trustee, in the paper, in her report and the overview of our meeting. Simply put, Maureen is exploring options to establish a police presence as soon as possible and we will work with the school to get this completed ASAP.

Second, the Village Board is now pursuing an additional TIF District in the Village. This new TIF district will attempt to add a new TIF district adjacent to the current Downtown TIF. It will encompass the surrounding old gravel pits, parkland, flood plain, drainage land and areas for possible commercial development off of I-74. A new TIF will allow us to realize the full 23 years to improve these areas rather then the remaining years from our Downtown TIF. The areas are primarily free of roof tops which will reduce the impact on the other taxing bodies. The process will take up to 8 months and will require several public hearings. So if you are interested, please watch for these hearings.

Finally, there has been a lot of news regarding the proposed medical cannabis farm outside of Downs (unincorporated Downs). In June, the Board wanted me to pursue trying to attract or determine the validity of having a farm within our corporate limits. When reviewing the possible locations against the requirements we had 2 potential locations. Both of these locations were presented to the companies looking for locations, which quickly was apparent they would not be considered. This new location fits within the strict requirements by the state. There have been plenty of articles in the paper that cover most of these requirements. There are ways the Village can still benefit from this farm as the state requires a plan from the business on how they will give back to the area. I have been approached with several ideas, but I have nothing that is concrete enough to talk about.

VILLAGE OF DOWNS BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING OVERVIEW 7:00 PM

September 4, 2014

- 1. Mayor Mike James called the meeting to order at 7:05
- 2. Roll call was taken with Trustees Roach, Goveia, Freimann, Myszka and Luke all present. Trustee Lush was absent. Also present were Clerk James, Treasurer Zwilling and Attorney Wall.
- 3. Pledge of Allegiance was taken.
- 4. A motion to approve the order of the agenda was made and approved.
 - Discussion: Item 8ii should read November. Item 1iii, this ordinance will be scratched. We will post-pone a vote on Mr. Kretz's Eagle Scout project. Add discussion item for Beecher Trails railroad agreement.
- 5. Eagle Scout Project(s) Report. No report given.
- 6. Superintendent Report-Kevin Whitehouse reported that 1.333 million gallons was pumped to BNWRD last month. The iron content was 1.5.
 - We had a couple of leaks that were fixed this month. One boil order was issued. The water came back clean and the boil order has been lifted.
- 7. Engineer Report- Shawn from Farnsworth updated the board on Beecher Trails. .
- 8. Treasurer Report- We are still waiting for the audit report. The street fund is still rather tight.
- 9. Committee Report(s) No reports were given.
- 10. Mayoral Report- There is a Medical Cannabis farm being proposed 3 miles outside of Downs. The article was in The Pantagraph. Property values will increase which will benefit the school.
- 11. Trustee Reports
 - 1. Building Report- Trustee Freimann reported that we are getting about one building permit per month out at Cross Creek.
 - Water and Sewer Report- Trustee Myszka reported that water department purchased a computer to upgrade software. BNWRD paid for half of the computer.
 - 3. Police and Services Report- Trustee Roach is working with 3 properties over weeds. One property has been resolved.
 - Trustee Roach stated that she was disappointed that the article about Downs no longer having police coverage was published in The Pantagraph. She explained that originally she had asked for an \$85,000 budget for police and was told she had to cut to \$51,000.
 - She had a candidate ready. This person had to withdraw an hour before last month's meeting.
 - According to the article, Superintendent Dave Mouser said he was not given advance notice about no police coverage. This was not correct. She left him a phone message and an email.
 - She asked the county to reduce their hours from 26 to 20 hours and they declined.

- We are learning through this process that police coverage is important to this community.
- Other towns our size, co-op for police coverage. We don't tax like other municipalities do.
- 4. Streets Report- Mayor James reported for Trustee Lush. He asked for better cooperation with the water and sewer department.
- 5. Parks, Community Center and Food Pantry Report- Trustee Goveia reported that the spotted grass is bad in the playground and she is working on it.
 - They were accepted in the backpack program this year. Any student K-6 that qualifies for reduce lunch qualifies for this program.
 - The football team is having a fundraiser from Nelson's catering. Residents can donate their meal to the food pantry.
- 6. Finance Report- No report given.

 - Trustee Luke, Mayor James and Shawn from Farnsworth went through a series of interviews with TIF firms.

September 4, 2014

A new computer was purchased for the Village hall as an upgrade to run the water/sewer billing software. The old computer had an outdated operating system that was no longer being supported by Microsoft. BNWRD has offered to pay for half of the cost of that upgrade.

The water main break on Woodlawn that required a boil order was on a type of pipe and in a location that caused a delay in repairs. A special crew familiar with that transite pipe was brought in for that repair and I apologize for the delays.

Water and sewer report for the month of August 2014

9/3/2014

The sewer lift station delivered 1,332,000 gallons to BNWRD for the month, averaging 43,000 per day. The total water pumped for the month was 2,264,200 gallons for an average of 73,000 gallons per day. The average iron concentration in the finished water was 1.50 PPM for the month. Service line leaks were repaired at 106 E Garfield and 208 N Woodlawn. The water main was damaged during repairs at 208 and required a section of main to be replaced with a boil order being issued. No other main repairs were needed in August. The conversion to radio reads continues. We still have no results from the resent ISO inspection.


