COUNCIL REPORTS

9. MAYOR RANDY BRAILSFORD

Mayor Brailsford discussed the budget with the council, and stated he also spoke with the directors about the budget in directors meeting. He told the council and the directors to watch their budget. Make sure they are not overspending. Mayor Brailsford also talked about the Central Utah Clinic that is expected to be built by Olson Green House. There is also a discussion of a swimming pool with the clinic and the options with it.

Mayor Brailsford stated the position for the full time position for Safety and Storm Drain Coordinator. This has been opened up to the full time employees for now, and then will open to the public if no one puts in an application.

10. COUNCILPERSON STERLING REES

Councilperson Rees discussed the additions at the Arrowhead Substation is going well.

11. COUNCILPERSON JANIE CHRISTENSEN

Councilperson Christensen talked about the new computer at the library and how it allows residents to download e-books. The new library board members will be coming to council meeting on March 5 to be introduced. The "Bring Your Child to the Library Day" had about 200 people come to it.

The sewer plant also had two foaming incidents and the state was notified of it. The state is looking into it.

Bruce Ward reported the sewer manhole inspections have been completed.
