
### FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS

Because of the hot and dry conditions we have been experiencing, Salem City is once again implementing Fireworks Restrictions. Fireworks are PROHIBITED in the following areas:

- 1. South of the Highline Canal
- 2. East of Woodland Hills Drive
- 3. North of 400 North Street, except in developed subdivisions
- 4. Within twenty (20) feet of any building
- 5. Within two hundred (200) feet of any open field, unimproved lot with dry vegetation, or any vacant building with dry vegetation on the lot
- 6. Within two hundred (200) feet of any haystack, straw, or other flammable agricultural product.

## 2013/2014 Budget (also continued on page 2)



The General Fund budget for 2013/2014 is \$4,330,986. The above charts indicate how that operating budget is broken out for the general fund. Each year the enterprise (utility) funds transfers money to the general fund. The following amounts are being transferred to the General fund; Water Fund—\$36,000; Sewer Fund—\$17,500; Electrical Fund—\$300,000; Solid Waste Fund—\$12,500; PI Fund—\$5,000. In addition \$5,000 is transferred from each enterprise fund to be set aside for a future purchase of a public safety vehicle (Fire or Ambulance).

The overall Budget (General Fund + Enterprise Funds) for FY 2013/2014 is \$10,545,764, this is an increase of \$775,374 from last years budget. You can view the full budget on the city's web page at www.salemcity.org.

### UTILITY RATE INFORMATION

Salem City was faced with some rate increases this year from the Solid Waste District (SUVSWD) and Republic Services. With those increases the following rate increase was approved in the 2013/2014 Budget:

**Garbage Rates (affective August 1st):** Ist can increase \$0.50 (\$12.05 to \$12.55), and 2nd can and above \$0.25 (\$10.05 to \$10.30 (Note the last increase was 2010, the second can increased \$1.55 (from \$8.50 to \$10.05), but because of a clerical error, it only increased \$1.05. We are now fixing that error with this increase)).

Salem City also faced a rate increases this year from the Utah Municipal Power Association (UMPA) of .003 per kWh). With this increases the following rate increase was approved in the 2013/2014 Budget

## Residential Electric Rate Changes of \$0.003 per kWh (affective with August 2013 usage):

**Current Rate:** \$11.00 base rate; 0 – 500 kWh \$0.077659 per kWh; 501 – 999 kWh \$0.091650 per kWh; 1000 kWh \$1.50; 1001 – 1499 kWh \$0.11000 per kWh; 1500 kWh \$2.50; 1501 - ..... kWh \$0.11750 per kWh **New Rate:** (increase of .003). \$11.00 base rate; 0 – 500 kWh \$0.0806590 per kWh; 501 – 999 kWh \$0.0946500 per kWh; 1000 kWh \$1.50, 1001 – 1499 kWh \$0.1130000 per kWh; 1500 kWh \$2.50; 501 - ..... kWh \$0.1205000 per kWh.

# Senior Spotlight

Seventy-nine is just fine for this lady born in 1934, in New Mexico. **Leola Butler** has lived in Salem since 1968 when she and her husband, Glen, bought the home in which she still lives.

While in high school she worked at an Indian Trading Post in Ship Rock, New Mexico. She gained a love for Indian art and has many pieces in her home, including sand paintings. In high school she was on the softball, basketball, and volleyball teams. After graduating from high school she moved to Spanish Fork and lived with an aunt and uncle. She worked at the old "91 Café" in Spanish Fork which was where Zions Bank is now located. It was also the bus depot. She also worked at the Ideal Café.

In 1953 Glen Butler got home from the service. He would come into the "91Café" and this is where they met. They were married in 1954 in Waterflow, New Mexico. They first lived in the Mel Hanks' "honeymoon cabin". Then they moved to Spanish Fork and then back to Salem in 1968. Glen worked at Geneva U.S. Steel for 45 years. He passed away in 1994. They had three children; Gordon who lives in Spanish Fork; Anna Jean (Steve) Frost from Spanish Fork; and Mary Lou (Roger) Warner who lives in Lehi. They have 7 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren. Leola was fortunate not to have to work outside of the home after they were married.

She has been very involved with the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers. She does tours of the DUP Cabin at Heritage Park, explaining the monuments and items in the cabin. In May they had 106 fourth and fifth graders from Foothill Elementary who were studying Utah History, tour the cabin site.

When Glen was alive they loved to go fishing, hunting and camping. She still loves to fish at Salem Pond which she does with her sister-in-law. She has held several positions in the L.D.S. Church but enjoyed being librarian for 13 years. She loves Salem; the people are nice, friendly and giving. She is appreciative of the Salem City employees and Police Department saying "whenever they are needed, they are always there". She likes chocolate and Mexican food. She loves a challenging jig saw puzzle, working with plastic canvas, painting ceramics, and collecting frogs. She likes to tell jokes. She has three sisters who still live in New Mexico and four step-sisters, two in Arizona and two have passed away. Leola was selected as Salem Volunteer of the Year for 2012. She has a great love for her family and is very emotional when she speaks about them.
