

**Class Name:** Wool Crazy

**Supplies Needed:**

My class sample measures approximately 20" square. It could be used as a small table piece, wall hanging, or pillow cover. I could make additional blocks and set together for a quilt. If you want to make a table runner approximately 18" X 60, construct by making 3 units each approx 18" X 20".

**Wool** – Should be washed and felted to prevent raffling. If you purchase hand dyed wool, there is no need to wash because it is already felted in dying process. If you have recycled wool from thrift sales or wool off the bolt, I would recommend machine washing with detergent in hot water, rinse in cold water, and put in dryer to dry.

**Book** – **WOOL CRAZY** by JoAnn Mullaly (Has lots of design ideas for appliqué and stitching.)

If you have a book on embroidery stitches you may want to bring to class.

I found it helpful to stitch background pieces down with a whipstitch using **100% wool thread or wool/acrylic thread**. You could substitute with a fine cotton thread in colors to match your foundation patches, or just use perle cotton with decorative embroidery stitches to sew down patches.

**To make one 20" OR 24" square Bring the following:**

**FOUNDATION FABRIC** ¾ yard of osnaberg or a homespun fabric (this will be used as a foundation (it is better to have a fabric with a more open weave) cut into 20" or 24" sq

**Batting** – 20" or 24" square of Warm and Natural (which is needle punch batting) You might not be doing much quilting so this batting will not migrate.

Bring pencil and paper for notes or General's marking pencil if you want to mark fabrics

**Wool for foundation patches** – 15-20 small pieces of wool approx 7" X 9" in a variety of values, colors and textures. Patches will overlap ¼" to ½" in construction process

**Wool for appliqué** – a variety of scraps with a wide range of value, color and textures

**Freezer paper** for tracing patterns from your book – also bring designs of your favorite things

**Straight Pins and Applique Pins**

**Scissors** – paper scissors, fabric scissors, and small embroidery scissors

Optional – Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler

**#8 Perle Cotton** in many colors for the embroidery stitches or threads of your choice

**Embroidery Needle** in size 3 or 4 that will work with your threads

**Crewel needle** size 2----also needle for beading if you want to add bead embellishment

**Embellishments** – Ribbons, Buttons, Beads, Rick Rack, etc

**Wool/acrylic thread** or cotton thread (see above note about sewing patches to foundation)

OPTIONAL -I did find it easier to do the decorative stitching when I already had the patches sewn in place rather than just being pinned.
