

ORDINANCE NO. 20

An ordinance relating to misdemeanors

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the city of Haven.

Section 1. Fast riding or driving on the streets:-

Whoever shall in this city ride or drive any horse, mule or other beast, faster than an ordinary traveling gait, or who shall so recklessly ride or drive as to endanger the safety of others, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

Section 2. Providing for the Discharge of Fire arms:-

Whoever shall in this city discharge any fire arms, except by permission of the mayor shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty five dollars.

Section 3. Throwing upon the Streets, etc.-: Any person who in this city shall throw any ball, stone, brick, piece of wood, clay or other hard substance along over or upon any street, alley, sidewalk, or at or against my house, building, or vehicle or at towards any person, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

Section 4. Hitching Horses, etc.-: Any person in this city who shall leave any horse, or other animal, or any team of any kind, standing upon any street, alley or vacant piece of ground without securely fastening the horse, animal or team by the head or neck to a post or other permanent object, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding ten dollars.

Section 5. Leaving Horses Hitched, etc.-: If any party or parties hitch a horse, team, or any other animals to a hitch rack or leaving it stand any place in the city of Haven for more than ten hours, the marshall shall have power to take same to the livery barn and place in the hands of the livery men to be cared for until owner calls and pays all charges, then the same to be released.

Section 6. Trespassing on sidewalks:- Whoever shall ride or drive along or upon any of the sidewalks any horse, mule, other animal, or team to the terror or great danger of others shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty dollars.

Section 7. This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its publication.
