

ORDINANCE NO. 30

An ordinance regulating the obstruction of certain railroad crossings in the City of Haven and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and council of the city of Haven:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, railroad or railway company or corporation, to obstruct the free use and passage of Kansas Avenue of said city of Haven for a longer period than ten minutes by means of any train, car, truck or locomotive engine.

Section 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in the sum of ten dollars.

Section 3. When the name of the person violating section one of this ordinance is not known, or he cannot easily be arrested, the railroad or railway in whose employ he is may be sued in the name of the city before the police judge in a civil action to recover the sum of \$10.00 (Ten Dollars), the penalty prescribed in section no. 2.

Section 4. This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its publication in the Haven Journal.
