

ORDINANCE NO. 367

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE LOCATION OF HOUSE TRAILERS AND TRAILER COACHES IN THE CITY OF HAVEN, KANSAS, PROHIBITING THEM IN CERTAIN AREAS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HAVEN, KANSAS:

Section 1. No person shall occupy any trailer coach or house trailer on any premises situated outside an approved trailer coach park or camp; provided, however, that the parking of one visiting trailer coach or house trailer in an accessory private garage building or in the yard of any premises shall be permitted for a period of two weeks.

Section 2. This Ordinance does not pertain to existing trailer coaches or house trailers located within the city limits.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding twenty-five dollars for each violation. Each day in which any such violation shall continue shall be deemed a separate offense.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication once in the official city paper.
