

ORDINANCE NO. 4

Be it ordained by the Mayor and councilmen of the city of Haven.

Section 1. The owner of any animal that shall die within the city shall within twenty-four hours after its death cause the carcass to be removed beyond the city limits; and in no case shall the owner of such animals permit the carcass to remain in the open air until it becomes offensive in smell. Any person violating this section shall be fined not one nor more than fifty dollars.

Section 2. If any person shall own, keep or use any yard, pen or place on his or her premises under his or her control in or upon which any number of cattle or other animals shall be kept in such a manner as to be or become offensive to those residing in the vicinity or annoying to the public, he shall be deemed to maintain a nuisance to the city and shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Section 3. Any person who in this city shall cause or suffer any offal, manure, rubbish, filth, slop, or suffer any animal or vegetable or refuse or any foul or nauseous liquor or water to be discharged or flow from the premises occupied by him or to be thrown into, deposited in or upon any street, alley, public square, vacant lot or any other place in this city, shall be fined in any sum not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section 4. Any person who in this city shall keep any grounds, yards, stockyards or any house, shop stable or other place in this city in such a condition as to be offensive and a nuisance shall be guilty of maintaining a nuisance and shall be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars for the first offense and a like sum for each day that same shall continue.

Section 5. Any person in this city who shall suffer or permit any cellar vault, privy drain, pool, privy sewer or sink upon his or her premises or premises under his or her control to become nauseous, foul, offensive or injurious to public health shall be deemed guilty of maintaining a nuisance and fined in any sum not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Section 6. This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its publication.
