ORDINANCE NO. 5

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO MISDEMEANORS

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Haven,

ARTICLE 1

OFFENSES AGAINST THE PUBLIC PEACE AND SAFETY.

Section 1. Unlawful Assembly. Any two or more persons who shall, in this city, assemble together with intent, or being assembled shall mutually agree to do any unlawful act with force or violence, against the property of this city, or against the person or property of another, or against the peace or to the terror of another or others, and shall make any movement or preparations therefor, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, and may be imprisoned not exceeding thirty days.

Section 2. Disturbing of the Peace. Any person, in this city, who shall assault another, or assault and beat another, or who shall wrangle, quarrel, fight or challenge another to fight or attempt to provoke others to fight wrangle or quarrel, or shall use any abusive or any indecent language, menace, or threats of violence, or who shall use insulting language calculated to provoke a breach of the peace, or who shall be guilty of violent, turbulent, or tumultuous conduct, or conduct offensive to others, or who shall make any loud, unusual noise offensive to others, or

who shall use any profane, obscene or indecent language in any public street, lane or alley or public place in the city, or any person who shall make or permit any offensive noise or disturbances about the premises under his or her control, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

ARTICLE II.

OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC MORALS AND DECENCY

Section 1. Drunkenness. Whoever shall, in this city, be found in a state of intoxication in aby, street, alley, lane or public place or who shall be found in a state of intoxication in any private house or other place to the annoyance of any citizen or person, shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars.

This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its publication.
