

ORDINANCE NO. 7

An ordinance concerning the duties of the city marshal and street commissioner.  
Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the city of Haven.

Section 1. That the city marshal shall be ex-officio street commissioner and shall have power to do and perform each and every duty prescribed by law and ordinance for said street commissioner.

Section 2. Before entering upon the duties of his office the city marshal shall take and subscribe an oath of office in the usual form and shall make and execute a bond with two or more sureties to be approved by the council in penal sum of \$300.00 conditional for the faithful performance of his duties as Marshall.

Section 3. The marshal shall execute all orders of the city council and shall see that ten ordinances of the city are strictly enforced, shall give the council notice of all nuisances which he is not by law or ordinance empowered to abate summarily and in such cases when so ordered by the council he may proceed to abate the same at cost of party making or suffering it. He shall be industrious and vigilant in preventing violations of the city ordinances and in prosecuting offenders of laws of State or City. He shall suppress all affrays, routs, disturbances, riots and other breaches of the peace within the city. When an offense is committed in his presence he shall arrest the offender without warrant and bring him before the police Magistrate to be dealt with according to law and for this purpose may hold the party in custody not exceeding forty-eight hours.

Section 4. The Marshall shall be chief of Police and shall at all times have power to make arrest with or without process or order the arrest of all offenders against the laws of the State or of the city by day or by night; to keep all persons arrested in the city prison, county jail, or other proper place, to prevent their escape until a trial can be had before the proper officer: and to execute all processes issued by the police Judge and delivered to him for that purpose.

Section 5. He shall keep a just and true account of any and all money received by him for the use of the city and pay same to the city treasurer on the last Saturday of each and every month, taking a receipt for same.

Section 6. The Marshall, in addition to the duties set out herein, shall do and perform all other acts that may be required of him now or hereafter by the law, ordinances, mayor or council.

Section 7. The Street commissioner shall have general care, control, and supervision of streets, alleys, sidewalks and highways in the city.

Section 8. Said street commissioner shall remove or cause to be removed all obstruction to the free passage along any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks or highways in the city, and upon failure of any person to remove obstruction when notified, the said commissioner shall have power to remove same and charge same to the offenders.

Section 9. It shall be his duty to see that the laws, contracts, ordinances and rules of the council concerning and relative to the grading of the streets and the laying of sidewalks are strictly enforced, and he shall execute all orders and ordinances in any way affecting the streets, alleys, sidewalks, highways, gutters, bridges, and culverts within the city.

Section 10. This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its publication.
