

ORDINANCE NO. 8

An ordinance regulating the duties of the Police Judge.

Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the city of Haven.

Section 1. That the police judge before entering upon the duties of his office shall take and subscribe an oath to faithfully perform the duties of his office and shall make and execute bond, with two or more sufficient sureties to be approved by the mayor and council, in the sum of \$500.00 conditional for the faithful performance of his duties as police judge.

Section 2. The police judge shall, in addition to other duties required of him by law and ordinances, keep a true and correct record of all cases tried or brought before him, and cases of complaint with an entry of all proceedings had therein, and of the final disposition made thereof, and at the first regular meeting in each month shall make to the city council a full and complete report of the proceedings before him for the preceding month, which report shall state the names of the parties prosecuted before him, the nature of the charge, the amount of the fine and cost assessed, the amount paid in and collected, the final disposition of the case; which report shall also show amount paid to the city, treasurer, and he shall transmit with such report all forfeited recognizance in his possession; which report shall be submitted to and approved by the city council.

Section 3. He shall hear and determine all offenses against the city ordinance under such rules as are prescribed by or may be fixed by ordinance.

Section 4. Upon Saturday of each and every week he shall pay to the city treasurer all moneys which may have come into his hands belonging to the city during the preceding week, taking his receipt therefor.

Section 5. This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its publication.
