Meeting opened at 7:00 p.m

1. Opening Ceremony--Council Member Kliger gave a thought and Council Member Andersen led the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. Approval of January 9, 2014 Council Meeting Minutes--Minutes were reviewed.

3. Proposed Approval Monthly Bills—Bills were reviewed.

4. Planning and Zoning Review—Council Member Kliger did an excellent job on the power point for the Burbanks. It showed exactly where the town stands on the subdivision. The Council

still needs to find out where the public road ends. The Burbanks can sell undeveloped lots. At the selling of the 2nd lot they must have infrastructure.

New Business:

5. Earth Day Discussion/Sherry Goring—We need to do a cleanup for the park and walking trail. It would be nice to have the cook shack open for 150 people that are expected on April 22 at 6:30 pm. The cook shack needs cleaning and painting. The Town will provide funds for project. See attached memo. Council Member Bingham suggests we use sterilant instead of preemergent for weed control. Maybe the County will chip in to help control noxious weed. Round up is temporary. Council member Kliger will check out the options.
6. Water System Improvements to Chlorination System—The information from Wetco is for well #2 which is the smaller well. Right now we have no way to chlorinate the small well. The cost is \$12,140 as a quote to upgrade that one. Spring #2 on south end of town is with the 2nd quote. And the quote for \$2830 includes the north spring. We will need a solar power pack. We would start with the north end because it is a consistent flow. These are just general bids. The next step would be more quotes. We need to find out maintenance cost on the new systems.
7. Medical Training When No Medical Help Is Available—There will be a training session on Tues March 11 at 6:00 pm.

Unfinished Business:

8. Fire District Information, Emergency Management—We had some flooding in town and we used over ½ the sandbags we have. We had lots of help. Cert teams were activated. We need to get more sandbags. The county will get us as many as we need.
9. Sesquicentennial 2014 Activities – Feb 4 was the 150 days of fitness start in preparation for the 5k run. There will be flyer to order t shirts and hats. There will be a history book, a cookbook and lots of old pictures. We will try to get Rob Bishop to speak on Memorial Day.
10. CERT Training will be finished Saturday. We need better communication. There were no radios in hand for the flooding. We need a phone tree. Deweyville should have its own pump. We need to check out prices for next month's meeting.
11. Rural Water Conference Attendees—There will be no one representing Deweyville this year.

If anyone in Deweyville is interested they need to contact her. It will be three 4 hour classes probably in March. Jennie Goring is helping put it together.

13. Documentation, Public Info. Ordinance Enforcement (Eric Andersen) No one can burn. It is expensive if you get ticket. There is training for ordinance enforcement. Maybe our best option is someone from out of town.
14. Park, Walking Trail, Tree Board P&Z, (Joe Kliger)--There will be lots of baseball this summer.
15. Buildings and Cemetery Maintenance (Todd Bingham)--Gardner's will work on the cemetery this year. Andrew Taylor will be back for park and or cemetery. No one can go over 30 hrs.
