1. Opening Ceremony--Mayor Thayne gave a Prayer, and Kathy Gudmundson led the /Pledge of Allegiance.
2. Approval of February 13, 2014 Council Meeting Minutes--

4. Planning and Zoning Review—there was no meeting. All board positions are now filled.

New Business:

5. Park and Cemetery Improvements—Council Member Bingham needs to get a tree for the cemetery. He says he will get the tree board on task. We have coupons from Rocky Mountain Power to replace the trees in cemetery. There is a luncheon for tree city on April 16.. The cook shack will be improved this year. The town needs a storage shed or to enclose the back patio.

Unfinished Business:

6. Fire District Information, Emergency Management—We will be filling sandbags at 9 am on this Saturday. There will also be a group hanging pictures in the town hall. Council Member Bingham will

get us load of sand. Phone calls and church announcements have been made. The town now has pumps. We need to get two 200 foot discharge hoses at about \$2 a foot. Council member Bingham will purchase these. The town has some B & C road funds and Mayor Thayne will purchase some road signs for emergencies. Council member Spackman will research where we can obtain these signs.

7. Sesquicentennial 2014 Activities—Charlotte Meservy brought some printed advertisements for shirts etc. There was a discussion about if we want to purchase meat ahead of time to save money. Movie night will be the Spackman's responsibility. The town will have a ball game. Games will be for all ages. There will be a beard growing contest. An art show is in progress. The Deweyville Quilt is almost done at senior center. Larry Fraser is working on a memorial coin for purchase of \$10 each. The cookbook is in progress. The Mayor will put out a newsletter in April. A dutch oven cookoff and candy drop is in progress. There will be a run. We have been asked to hold our Easter Egg Hunt at 10 am so all the towns are on the same schedule.
8. Earth Day Discussion—Earth Day will be on April 22 The town will provide hot dogs. There should be about 150 people. We will plant trees and get the park ready for summer.

The Conservancy will lend equipment to help locate lines and meters. We have 3 meters that are up by homes instead by the road. Bobby Gardner passed his test for water master. He over certified so we received 10 extra points.
