Meeting opened at 7:00 p.m

1. Opening Ceremony—Council Member Spackman gave a Prayer, and Council Member Bingham led the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. Approval of March 14, 2014 Council Meeting Minutes—There was a discussion of the minutes

MOTION: Council Member Spackman made the motion to approve the minutes for March 14, 2014. Council Member Andersen seconded the motion. Motion passes unanimously.

3. Proposed Approval Monthly Bills--The bills were reviewed. Council Member Bingham wants to know where he should store the new pumps. There was a discussion about covering the patio for storage.

4. Discussion About Budget Items for 2015 Budget—There was a discussion about each departments budget and they reviewed the Profit & Loss statement. Each Council Member needs to prepare the budgets for their departments.
5. Planning and Zoning Review—there was no meeting. There was a discussion about upcoming events.

New Business:

6. April 26th Clean Up Day—Sherie Goring has two flyers that she wants approved. Council approved both flyers. There was a discussion about moving the bleachers and removing the mud cleaners. Parking that day might be a problem. Tree and bush trimmings will need to be taken to the dump. Council Member Kliger will get hot dogs. Council Member Bingham will bring root beer. The National

Honor Society at Bear River High School might be able to help. Council Member Bingham will contact them.

7. Memorial Day Celebration—Rob Bishop will be speaking. Honeyville wants to join us in the celebration. Parking may be an issue. Council Member Bingham is thinking of the parking above the cemetery. People should bring their own chairs. Town scouts will do flags. The Bitner girls will sing the National Anthem. The cub scouts will do individual flags on each grave. Charlotte Meservy will make up an agenda. Council Member Andersen will get someone to play taps. Council Member Bingham will get the microphone and podium set up. There will be a write up in the Leader. We need to get new flags.

Unfinished Business:

8. Fire District Information, Emergency Management—nothing new
9. Sesquicentennial 2014 Activities—A newsletter was sent in mail. Council Member Kliger would like to hire someone to run the cook shack. The shifts were too long last year. We are taking orders for the cookbook, t-shirts, coins, and the run.

Public Comments: This is an opportunity for the public to address the council.

Please limit your comments to three minutes. Cameron Rhodes asked Bear River high school how much their cook shack makes and they make about \$120 a night to run the cook shack. He has 4-5 ball teams a night for 3 nights a week for the next 12 weeks scheduled at our park. Council Member Kliger needs to advertise for someone to run cook shack. Cam's ball parents could barter help in cook shack in lieu of tournament fees. You still need a supervisor with a food handler's permit. Council Member Kliger talked about using volunteers means you are constantly training people which sometimes causes confusion. The bathrooms were hard to maintain last year. If Cam provides 4 volunteers for cook shack, 2 volunteers to clean garbage and 2 volunteers to clean bathroom and they would prepare the playing fields, then the town would waive \$35 rental fee. Cameron is asking the town to purchase the fences that should last 5-10 years. Cost will be \$1834 for both fields. Council Member Kliger and Cam will work out details on field fees. Council discussed the issue and decided the town may need to wait on fences.

Council Member Reports:

- 10 Water and Roads (Nathan Spackman)—Barricades need to go up.
- 11 Documentation, Public Info. Ordinance Enforcement (Eric Anderson)—Box Elder County will no longer be able to burn without a permit. The fine will be \$900. You must have a ring of rocks and 10 feet cleared area for a marshmallow fire. The air clearing index now determines when you can burn. All fires must be attended.
- 12 Park, Walking Trail, Tree Board P&Z, (Joe Kliger) Andrew and his dad serviced the mower so it is in good working order.
- 13 Buildings and Cemetery Maintenance (Todd Bingham)--We need to recover or side the cook shack. Council Member Bingham is thinking about composite board which looks nice. Council Member Bingham and Council Member Kliger will work together to get it done. We need more storage. There was a discussion about enclosing part of the patio. The Council agrees. Council Member Bingham will start getting bids for next year. The town might want to get a roll up doors.

MOTION: Council Member Spackman made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Council Member Kliger seconded the motion. Motion passes unanimously.
