7. Fire District Information, Emergency Management—There was one report of an untended fire call. A ticket was issued.
8. Sesquicentennial 2014 Activities—Cookbooks, coins, and t-shirts, are all being sold now. The t-shirt order goes in tomorrow. The Town Council can buy from them at cost. Per the Utah Highway Patrol, we can close the road for the activities. Deputy Archuleta from the Sheriff’s Department will be here to participate. The Mayor presented the schedule. He asked town council to each spend 45 minutes doing cook-shack duties. Council Member Kliger said he and his wife will cover cook shack from 11 to 3. , the rest of the Council will fill in if needed. The Mayor will bring in porta potties. The Dutch oven cook-off is cancelled so town will buy pulled pork and rolls. Salads and Desserts will be donated. The Mayor presented an example of the insert that was done by the Leader Newspaper for Honeyville, ours will be similar. The Leader would like us to put in a full page ad for \$450. It was decided to donate \$100 dollars to the Leader to help with the cost of the insert.

Deputy Archuleta reported that there was a break in at the cabinet shop but neighbors were watching and called deputies. She will be doing RAD again and will come out to us for the classes. Girls under the age of 18 must have their mother with them.

Council Member Reports:

- 10 Water and Roads (Nathan Spackman)—Rather than putting money into the chlorinator at the springs, Council Member Spackman would prefer to concentrate on the old well improvements.

- 11 Documentation, Public Info. Ordinance Enforcement (Eric Andersen)—Business licensing was discussed. Council decided to study the issue until next month. Council Member Andersen is going to the September water class.
- 12 Park, Walking Trail, Tree Board, P & Z (Joe Kliger)—
- 13 Buildings and Cemetery Maintenance (Todd Bingham)—Council Member Bingham said he is having a hard time getting bids for siding on the cook-shack. He has one bid for \$3000 but he needs three. He will continue working to get the other bids. He, also, has two bids for the covering of the patio for storage.
