There will be a parade at 10 am. The Council needs to be thinking about next years festivities as it will be the 150th year anniversary of the town.
- 13. Fire District Information, Emergency Management—The Mayor presented the calls for the month.

- 15. Documentation, Public Info. Ordinance Enforcement (Eric Andersen)—Mayor Thayne and Council Member Andersen are getting bids for a new fire house. There was a discussion of the best place to put the firehouse.

- 16. Park, Walking Trail, Tree Board P&Z, (Joe Kliger)—The cook shack is ready. Council member Kliger is looking for a way to control inventory and cash. He wants a petty cash fund and a cash box to work out of.
- 17. Buildings and Cemetery Maintenance (Todd Bingham)—The cemetery is looking good. The new pump is wonderful.
