4. Possible 2013 Softball Tournaments in Deweyville/Mark Fryer—He and Jamie Sommers are looking for places for a large tournament. It would be three days—Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. It is an ASA tournament and would be held the first part of May and then again the first week of August. They would need all our fields. The fields would need to be approved by ASA. Teams would be rotated between Tremonton and surrounding cities. We could open our cook shack for some revenue. Fences may be an issue but there are temporary fences that could be used.

8. Walking Trail Discussion—Council Member Kliger is researching whether we can use culinary water efficiently to water the plants so the sprinkler heads don't get clogged.
9. Lish Bench Placement—Council Member Kliger will contact the family and research where they would like the bench placed.
10. Town Garage Sale and Pumpkin Walk—Pumpkin Walk is set for October 13<sup>th</sup> from 11 am to 4 pm. The Garage Sale will be September 15<sup>th</sup>. The Mayor will have the newsletter ready to go within the next week, so if anyone has things to add, please let him know.
