"2014 Drill Down for Safety"

It's that time of year again when we get together as a community and practice our emergency response skills. The Drill this year will be held on September 15, 2014 in Lindon City with the partnership of the "Federal Emergency Management Agency" and "Be Ready Utah." This event is scheduled each year to occur near the anniversary of the terror events of 9/11 with the intent of raising awareness and agency ability in the areas of emergency management and emergency preparedness. This year's Drill has been in planning since last year's drill! Our dedicated team of Volunteer Drill Coordinators and Committee Chairs seem to never stop coming up with good ideas. They always seem to find new ways to create stress for me and our emergency response team and to train us all to be a little safer!

This year, events here in Utah should make it very evident to all of us that we are vulnerable to a variety of events in our City which could result in a need for a neighborhood and community response. As I write, folks in Levan and Eagle Mountain are digging out from mudslides as a result of earlier fires and thunderstorms. There have been over 400 wildfires so far this year across the state and floods and landslides from severe thunderstorms have closed and damaged several roadways. There have even been a couple of violent crimes here in Lindon which came very close to requiring temporary evacuations and community notifications. These events have affected the lives of many of our neighbors and friends and we never know when we could be next!

Following the training event for Block Captains on August 28th, the Drill itself will be held on September 15th at precisely 6:00 pm. At that time we ask for everyone in the City to respond to their Block Captains home. If you will be out of town or cannot attend that evening, please let a trusted neighbor know in advance so they can report that your family is away and accounted for. In an actual event, that little notification may save hours of unnecessary resources spent searching to determine your condition. For most of you that is the only request. Block Captains, Neighborhood Coordinators and Area Coordination Teams will then work with City Emergency Managers to develop and improve upon communication channels to the City Emergency Operations Center and then practice sending resources, personnel, supplies and information back into the areas of the City that are in need. Our goal is to work through problems and make our mistakes as we practice the drill and not in an actual future emergency.

Lindon City will continue to lead in the effort of personal preparedness, and as a city we are dedicated to promoting safety and emergency preparedness efforts among its residents. Our efforts as a community are getting attention, as each year more and more surrounding cities come to observe us and have us help them to develop their own preparedness programs. Please participate in the drill and make this a fun event with neighbors and friends as you practice together for that day which we all hope will never come!

"CHILD FIND" PROGRAMS NOTICE

The Alpine School District Department of Special Education is attempting to contact persons with disabilities between the ages of birth and twenty-one, in compliance with the Federal law, which mandates the provision of free educational programs and /or services for such persons. If a child is having significant difficulty with vision, hearing, speech, behavior, is experiencing slow development untypical for hi/her age, physical impairments, or learning difficulty, he/she may be a child with a disability. If you know of any child whom you feel might qualify for these services, including students suspected of having a disability even though they are advancing from grade to grade, in a private school, homeless, immigrant, please contact the principal of your school or the Special Education Office of Alpine School District at 801-610-8410. If you are the parent of the child with an IEP enrolled in a public school, we are required by Utah Code to inform you of the availability of a scholarship to attend a private school through the Carson Smith Scholarship Program. RECORDS DESTRUCTION NOTICE

Alpine School District is required to give public notice before destroying archived special education records. Records will be destroyed at the end of 2014.
