1. **Public Hearing (Continued)** – *Ordinance Amendment – Lindon City Code, Chapter 18.03 (Definitions & Regulations) and Lindon City Code, Chapter 18.04 (Billboard Advertising) #2012-11-O.* The City Council will hear public comment and possibly act to approve an amendment to LCC, Chapter 18.03 and Chapter 18.04 dealing with digital billboard advertising. This item was continued from the meeting of September 4, 2012. The Planning Commission recommended approval. - 20 minutes
2. **Public Hearing** – *Ordinance Amendment – Lindon City Code, Title 6 (Animal Ordinance) #2012-12-O.* The City Council will hear public comment and possibly act to approve an amendment to LCC, Title 6 (Animal Ordinance). The Planning Commission has met several times over the past few months and made extensive updates to help clarify the current language in the ordinance. The Planning Commission recommended approval with several changes. - 45 minutes
3. **Public Hearing** – *Ordinance Amendment – Lindon City Code, Chapter 17.47(Research and Business Zone) #2012-13-O.* The City Council will hear public comment and possibly act to approve an amendment to LCC, Chapter 17.47 (Research and Business Zone). The changes will remove uses listed within this ordinance which are duplicated in the Standard Land Use Table and will standardize fencing requirements. The Planning Commission recommended approval with changes. - 20 minutes
4. **Review and Action** – *Personnel Action Request.* This is a request by staff for the approval of an increase in compensation for an employee working “out of class.” - 10 minutes
