Lindon's New Emergency Notification System!



We're excited to roll out our new emergency notification system – Everbridge – that will call/text/email citizens during emergencies or other public notice needs. Please be aware this system replaces the old emergency notification system and any information you may have entered previously is no longer valid. You will need to create a new account in the Everbridge system to receive notifications (see the link below to sign up). Total registration takes about 5 minutes. In this system you can prioritize how you want to receive notification messages (text first, then phone call, then email, etc.).

The system is set up to allow you to confirm to the sender that you've received the message. You can add other contact information for your spouse, children, etc. – *but if they get the message first and respond to it (confirm) then the message will not be delivered to you.* We therefore recommend that you enter any spouse or children contact info by creating their own individual log-in account. That way you will all be notified separately for emergencies.

The system also allows location-based notifications. So, if you're interested in any notifications at your home, your place of work, or at a child's school address, you can enter those different addresses with the desire to be notified of activities or events happening at or near those locations. GYMNASTICS/TUMBLING

This gymnastics/tumbling class is for beginners, children ages (3-9). Students will learn basic tumbling skills, and proper stretching techniques. 

HOME Rehabilitation Program

Need to make home improvements? The Housing Authority of Utah County offers low interest rehabilitation loans to qualified homeowners. The primary purpose of this program / loan is to help citizens live in safe and adequate housing. Loans can be used for roofing, plumbing, electrical, energy improvements, and code violations. Weatherization Program

This program is designed for low income families who need to have their homes weatherized. This program is multi-faceted in that helps clients with energy education, practical experience, indoor air quality, combustion safety, increased energy efficiency, and the physical comforts of a fully weatherized home. Weatherization repairs may include wall, floor, ceiling and duct insulation; windows, caulking, door repair or replacement, weather-stripping, furnace tune-up and repairs, and carbon monoxide testing.
