### Prepare to LIVE on the Fault Line!

As part of our emergency preparedness efforts, knowledge about some of our biggest risks could be useful. So this month, let's talk earthquakes! In reality, the possibility of a major earthquake happening here is extremely likely. In geologic time it might not happen for 10,000 years, but it could happen tomorrow. Living here in Utah, most of us have heard of our neighbor the Wasatch Fault. The fault is a geologic feature extending through Utah from southern Idaho in the North, down to about the town of Fayette (Sanpete County) to the South. Underground pressures over many years cause the earth to rise or fall along fault lines located all around the world.

That is how over millions of years, our beautiful mountains formed on the east side of the Valley. Throughout my life, we have been warned about "The Big One" that is going to happen in Utah one day, so for many years we have tried to prepare for what could occur when... not if, the fault decides that it's time to move. Scientists have warned that the result of a large fault movement could be a serious earthquake event that would greatly affect us all. Here are some facts that you may not know about the Wasatch Fault.

The Wasatch Fault runs for 240 miles along the Wasatch Front and what is known as "the Provo Segment" runs on the east side of Lindon along the foothills. Scientifically the fault is called a "Classic Long-Normal Fault" and it is the largest fault of its type in the world. It is widely recognized as having the greatest earthquake risk in the interior western United States. Mostly because it's been so long since it has had a large movement. In addition to the Wasatch, there are at least 11 other faults identified in Utah Valley, with most being located in the valley floor under Utah Lake.

Like all active faults in Utah, the Wasatch Fault was created and is still active because the Earth's crust is being stretched, or extended, in an east-west direction. Mount Timpanogos is actually rising a few millimeters a year, with history showing past events of sudden slips of 8 to 12 feet. The last damage causing earthquake which is attributed to the Wasatch Fault is the magnitude 4.3 earthquake which happened under Herriman in 1992.

Geologic studies show the good news is that in Utah's history a Wasatch Fault earthquake measuring 5.5 to 6.5 on the Richter scale, which would cause significant damage, only occurs about every 350 years. The bad news is that it's been much longer than that since we have had one! A Wasatch Fault slip of 12 feet happens about every 1,300 years. If it happened tomorrow, such a slip could create a magnitude 7.0 or greater earthquake, which could result in an estimated 10,000+ deaths, 100,000+ injuries and an estimated \$60 Billion in economic loss in Utah Valley. It's kind of scary that it's been far beyond the 1,300 year average since this area has had such a large event. That is why we, as emergency responders, train and plan that this could happen.

With knowledge comes power. I encourage you to prepare to LIVE, to survive and recover from an earthquake or other disaster event. Prepare a 72 hour kit or even better a 96 hour kit for each family member. Keep at least several days of non-perishable food and water on hand. Create a family safety plan with designated meeting places and have a plan for shelter. At least have a plan! A good checklist of emergency necessities is available at BeReadyUtah.

- Remember that overfilling your recycling container makes it difficult for Republic Services to empty your container.

### FIREWORKS DISCHARGE RESTRICTIONS

Because of a result of extreme fire danger along our mountain interface and our west wetland area, Lindon City has a permanent fireworks and open fire restriction in place. These areas include all land west of Interstate 15 within the Lindon City limits, including the Lindon Marina. This also includes all "Undeveloped Land" within the City Limits as well as all City Parks. On the east side of town restrictions include all areas within an approximate distance of 500 feet from the foothills and U.S. Forest Service or BLM lands. This includes the Dry Canyon Trailhead and the 1200 East Horse Transfer Station. It was decided that in the interest of clarity, these boundaries would be drawn using existing city roads which are at least 500 feet from designated lands. Restriction warning signs will be posted near the border of restricted areas. Please help us all to be safe and to protect our beautiful natural environment and watershed. Lindon City will conduct a non-partisan Municipal General Election 5 to elect three (3) City Council seats to serve four-year terms of office beginning January 2016. If more than six (6) candidates file, a Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 11, 2015 to nominate six (6) candidates for the General Election to be held on November 3, 2015. Qualified residents of Lindon may become a candidate for office by filling out a "Declaration of Candidacy" in the office of the City Recorder at 100 North State Street, Lindon, Utah, during regular business office hours from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. between June 1, 2015 and June 8, 2015. ### **HOW I CAME TO LINDON......**



I came to Lindon when I was just six months old, and I have lived here ever since. My mother has lived here with me since she was twenty. My dad, except for being at school and on a mission, has lived in Lindon his entire life. His family goes back in this area to before Lindon was even a city. About 1882, my great-great-great grandfather, John Young Walker, bought some land in what is now Lindon. He owned the first automobile in Lindon, an old Model-T. Another of my 3<sup>rd</sup> great-grandparents was Henry Dittmore. He moved here in 1868 and built a small, log house which was added onto and was called the "greenhouse" by my family because of the green stucco on the outside. Eventually, it was rented out, usually to newlywed couples in the family. My parents were the last people to live in the Dittmore home.

### **Notice to Lindon City Utility Customers**

In compliance with Utah State law, Lindon City is disclosing proposed transfer of funds as part of the Fiscal Year 2015-2016 budget (July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016) from the utility enterprise funds to the general fund for use in supplementing such city services as fire, police, streets, administration, parks & recreation, and other important city functions. Similar transfers are annually made from the enterprise funds to the general fund in order to help maintain low taxes and fees in Lindon. Proposed amounts to be transferred from enterprise funds to the general fund are as follows:

Solid Waste Collection Fund: \$16,780

Sewer Fund: \$292,713Water Fund: \$317,491

Storm Water Drainage System Fund: \$161,872

• Telecommunications Fund: \$2,500

A public hearing will be held on **Tuesday**, **June 16**, **2015** at **7:00** pm at the Lindon City Center, 100 North State Street, Lindon, Utah regarding the adoption of the FY 2015-16 Lindon City budget which includes the proposed utility fund transfers.
