

Last November the residents of Lindon saw on their ballots an opinion question, which was whether our city should be authorized to raise the sales and use tax by 0.1% (or 1 cent of every 10 dollars spent in Lindon) to be used for cultural and recreational facilities and their ongoing operational expenses and ongoing operations of cultural organizations within Lindon City. 66.7% of those that voted said, "Yes". So, beginning April 1st this incremental increase was added, changing our city sales tax rate from 6.75% to 6.85%.

You might be asking, "So what exactly is the PARC Tax and how does it affect me?" Did you know that some of our sister cities have already implemented a similar tax and that when we shop in Orem, Cedar Hills, Salt Lake County and others for example, we are contributing to their recreational and cultural amenities? Now when people shop in Lindon, many of whom are not residents here, we can benefit by their purchases and receive revenue to provide improvements to our parks, trails, arts programs, and other recreational facilities that we can enjoy. And unlike the rest of the sales tax in which the state apportions parts of it to other entities, Lindon gets to keep 100% of this .01% right here to benefit our citizens. It is estimated that this new revenue will be at least \$300,000 this first fiscal year.

So how will Lindon use this money? Well, we as a Council are working closely with the Parks and Recreation Department to decide where these funds will best benefit and improve many areas of our city, and we want to hear from you! So far there are many plans but just to name a few, we are looking to buy much needed items for our Community Center, add playgrounds, benches, pavilions, sports and other features to your parks, add lights to our pool for evening use, and there are even grants being considered for non-profit cultural arts organizations.

Look for the new PARC logo that will show where your PARC tax dollars are being put to work! We want Lindon citizens to literally see how this brings them a better quality of life. Lindon is a great place to live and the goal is to use these funds wisely to make our community even better!


2014 MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY

FUN RECYCLING FACTS

Did you know that recycling cans cost less? It is \$3.19 cheaper to have a recycle can than to have a second garbage can! To order a recycle can or to replace your second garbage can call the Lindon City Utility Clerk at 801-785-5043 or stop by the City Center front desk.

Do Recycle:

- Corrugated cardboard
- Paperboard: cereal boxes, paper towel rolls, etc.
- Paper: magazines, junk mail, office paper, phonebooks, newspaper, paper grocery bags, etc.
- Aluminum and steel: soda cans, empty food cans, etc.
- Plastics: Any plastic marked 1-7 (on the bottom of the container) such as milk and juice jugs, shampoo bottles, detergent bottles, etc.

Don't Recycle:

- Glass products
- Styrofoam
- Food waste
- Green waste (branches, etc.)
- Soiled plastics
- Soiled cardboard

Some fun recycling facts:

- 70% of what residents throw into their garbage can is recyclable.
- It takes 88% less energy to create a plastic water bottle from recycled material as opposed to raw materials
- Recycling 1 aluminum can saves enough energy to power a TV for 2-3 hours
- Enough plastic is thrown away each year to circle the Earth four times
- Plastic takes up to 1,000 years to degrade in a landfill.


Chair Fitness Class!!
