

During the month the fire department was called to a structure fire, two pole fires, two fire alarm calls, and a downed power line, and happy to report no major damage. With all of the snow we have been getting please be mindful in keeping the fire hydrants on your property clear in the event of an emergency. Along with the calls the department answered during the month, they also participated in their weekly trainings held at Station 91 each Thursday, and a few of the firefighters finished their Advanced EMT class. December was a busy month for the department. Not only do the firefighters participate in their training, they also do their part in helping the community. We were proud to serve the Uintah Community by adopting a family as if they were our own. Christmas is a time of giving and spreading cheer; we hope this family felt that during the Christmas season. We also awarded
