



During the month of October Uintah City Fire Department focused on Fire Safety Month.

During the month the fire department was called to two structure fires, three traffic accidents, an illegal burn and a gas leak. Please be mindful of traffic laws and speed limits to keep you and your family safe. Along with the calls the department answered during the month, they also participated in a training hosted by Union Pacific covering railroad basics and chemical emergencies as well as their weekly trainings held at Station 91 each Thursday. The Fire Department will begin conducting pre-plan surveys of all the structures in the City. This allows Firefighters to have a basic sketch of your home, and where the utility shut offs are at so that if we are ever needed to respond to an emergency we can quickly locate the information. The more information we can prepare (such as pets, or residents with limited mobility, etc) the better our firefighters will be able to quickly make decisions during emergency situations. The Firefighters will be in uniform with an ID card, and will have a department vehicle close to them. They will have a short ½ page survey if you are willing to help out with it. When you see the firefighters out, please be sure to say hello to them – we are always happy to meet our citizens.
