

Quilt by Heidi Pridemore using the Suede Midtones fabric collection from P&B Textiles

Quilt size: 52" x 62"

This pattern allows you to choose where to place the different colors. The block is assembled using free-form construction and will be trimmed to size once it's completed. This pattern will make a unique quilt, as no two blocks will look alike.

Yardage

Fabric A	Pink	SUEM 300 LP	1 yard
Fabric B	Violet Blue	SUEM 300 BV	1 ³ /8 yards
Fabric C	Green	SUEM 300 M	1 5/8 yards
Fabric D	Yellow	SUEM 300 LX	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric E	Orange	SUEM 300 LO	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric F	Peach	SUEM 300 J	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric G	Red	SUEM 300 LR	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric H	Violet	SUEM 300 V	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric I	Lavender	SUEM 300 L	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric J	Light Blue	SUEM 300 EB	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric K	Blue	SUEM 300 SB	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric L	Lime	SUEM 300 YA	¹ / ₂ yard
Fabric M	Teal	SUEM 300 BG	1/4 yard
Backing	3 ¹ / ₂ yards of any Suede Midtones fabric		

Cutting

All strips are cut across the width of fabric.

Fabric A (Pink), cut:

- (6) 1 ¹/₂" x wof middle-border strips
- (1) 4" x wof strip; cut into (5) 4" squares
- See "Cutting the Strips" to cut strips

Fabric B (Violet Blue), cut:

- (7) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof outer-border strips
- (1) 4" x wof strip; cut into (5) 4" squares
- See "Cutting the Strips" to cut strips

Fabric C (Green), cut:

- (6) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof inner-border strips
- (6) 2 1/4" x wof binding strips
- See "Cutting the Strips" to cut strips

Fabric D (Yellow), cut:

Fabric E (Orange), cut:

Fabric F (Peach), cut:

Fabric G (Red), cut:

- (1) 4" x wof strip; cut into (5) 4" squares


• (1) 4" x wof strip; cut into (5) 4" squares

Cutting the Strips

1. Referring to the cutting list, cut each 18" x 21" piece of fabric in half along the fold to make two 18" x 21" pieces.


2. Select three fabrics for the first round of strips. The quilt in the photo uses yellow, lime and green for the first round. From the three fabrics, cut strips that measure $1 \frac{1}{2}$ wide at one end to $2 \frac{1}{2}$ wide at the other end and are 21" long. You'll need about 10 strips from each color. (You can cut more strips if you need them.)

3. For the second round of strips, cut the remaining nine fabrics into strips that measure $3 \frac{1}{2}$ wide at one end and 4" wide on the other end and are 21" long. You'll need about 36 strips from the assorted colors. (You can cut more strips if you need them.)



Making the Blocks

4. Trim the four sides of *each* 4" square to make a polygon shape. Make 20 assorted block centers.



5. Sew a strip from step 2 to the left side of a block center. Press the seam allowance toward the strip. Trim the ends of the strip even with the center piece.

TIP: If you sew more than one block center to a strip (similar to chain piecing) make sure to leave at least 1" above and below the block center to leave enough fabric for trimming the strip on an angle even with the center piece. **6.** Sew a strip from step 2 to the top of the block center. Press and trim the strip as before.


7. Sew a strip from step 2 to the right side of the block center; press and trim the strip.

8. Sew a strip from step 2 to the bottom of the center block; press and trim the strip.



9. Repeat steps 5–8, using the strips from step 3 and sewing the strips in the same order as the first round of strips. The block should measure about 13" square. (The size will vary due to the angled strips.) Repeat the process to make 20 blocks total.

10. Use a square rule to measure each block to make sure all of the blocks can be trimmed to $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " square. You may need to tilt the ruler to get the right size. If your blocks are not large enough, you can either add another round strips or trim all the blocks to a smaller size. Use the square ruler to trim each block to measure $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " square (or your chosen measurement).



Assembling the Quilt Top

11. Lay out the blocks in five rows of four blocks each. Join the blocks into rows and then join the rows.

12. Join the green 2 ¹/2"-wide strips end to end to make a long strip. Measure the length of the quilt top. Cut two strips to this length and sew them to the sides of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top. Cut two strips to this length and sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt top to complete the inner border.

13. Repeat step 12 using the pink $1 \frac{1}{2}$ "-wide strips for the middle border and the violet blue $3 \frac{1}{2}$ "-wide strips for the outer border.

14. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the green $2^{1/4}$ "-wide strips, bind the edges to finish.
