Minutes of the regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Apple Valley, Washington County, Utah that was held on the 17th day of June, 2010 at the Smithsonian Fire Department Building, 1777 N. Meadowlark Dr. Apple Valley, Utah.

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7pm.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Moser.
- 3. Roll Call: Frank Kolschefsky, Dale Kingsley, Evan Brown, Kevin Sair, Mayor Moser, Town Treasurer Linda Felder and Code Enforcement Office April Ruesch were present. Town Attorney Gary Kuhlmann and Town Clerk Shannon Moser were excused. April Ruesch took minutes.
- 4. Declarations of conflict of interests.

None stated.

5. Public Comments.

Curtis Gubler stated that having a comment section at the end of the meeting would be a good idea. Also wanted to know what the CERT Team was for if not emergencies. He also asked why the Town did not seem concerned with the water problem that happened two weeks ago. The Mayor stated that unfortunately the water problem was Mr. Gubler's problem and that as the Mayor he was not notified by the Water Company of the problem and when he called Mr. Gubler's cell phone no calls were returned. If Mr. Gubler wanted to discuss the issue further he could contact the Mayor after the meeting.

Dick Naylor stated that the Apple Valley Water Company had told the citizens that there was enough water for them to have their gardens and animals.

John Olsen asked why instead of fighting with the Water Company, the Town needs to hear their problems and try to help. Mayor Moser replied that until the Water Company contacts the Town then there is nothing to do.

Dale Kingsley made the motion to close the public comments section. Kevin Sair seconded the motion. Vote: Frank Kolschefsky-yes, Dale Kingsley-yes, Evan Brown-yes, Kevin Sair-yes and Mayor Moser- yes. Motion passed 5/0.

6. Public Hearing for the change to Title 10 Chapter 15 Sections 23&25.

Mayor Moser read the ordinance. Mr. Gubler asked if the new ordinance is allowing the containers as long they are painted. Mayor Moser stated that if they are under 200sq.ft. and are painted yes. Motion made by Evan Brown to close the public hearing. Dale Kingsley seconded the motion. Vote: Frank Kolschefsky-yes, Dale Kingsley-yes, Evan Brown-yes, Kevin Sair-yes and Mayor Moser- yes. Motion passed 5/0.

7. Discussion and possible action on Title 10 Chapter 15 Sections 23&25.

Evan Brown asked if they should have the ordinance state that the sheds need to be on the back half of the property or behind the house. Dick Naylor stated that it is already in the ordinance. Dale Kingsley made the motion to approve Ordinance No. 2010-16. Evan Brown seconded the motion. Vote: Frank Kolschefsky-yes, Dale Kingsley-yes, Evan Brown-yes, Kevin Sair-yes and Mayor Moser- yes. Motion passed 5/0.

8. Discussion and possible action on Town bulletin boards.

Mayor Moser stated that because of the recent rash of people posting negative things about business and other people on the bulletin boards that at this time the Town should take them down until people learn to follow the rules.

Dick Naylor asked if the Town is required to have the boards. Mayor Moser stated the Town is not required to have them. They were put up so the Town could inform the community of what was going on. Mr. Naylor said that the boards are a good idea but if they are being abused then to take them down.

Mike Maddocks stated that the boards should not be used that way. Is there any way to regulate the problem? Mayor Moser replied that it is not working and could cause a legal issue for the Town. We still have the trash bills and the website for information.

The Council members agreed that they would like to keep the boards but if things do not change they need to be taken down.

Bonnie Maddocks stated it would be a good idea for the Town to have a comment box for the negative things so they are not posted everywhere.

Motion made by Dale Kingsley to post a flyer on the board and in the trash bills that the bards will be taken down in 30 days if nothing changes. Kevin Sair seconded the motion. Vote: Frank Kolschefsky-yes, Dale Kingsley-yes, Evan Brown-yes, Kevin Sair-yes and Mayor Moser- yes. Motion passed 5/0.

9. Fire Department Report

Chief Denny Bass reported that it is a no burn season and if you need burn, to please contact the Department for permission. You can still roast hotdogs but please keep the water close. The Department attended a first responder program that will allow the department to assist when needed. They are still working on grants for the Department.

10. Report and recommendation from the Planning Commission.

Dick Naylor reported that the Commission had tabled Christen Barlow's request for a facility for rehabilitation for substance abuse, as he did not show up. They are still working on the zoning for the Alcohol Ordinance.

11. Report and recommendation from the Code Enforcement Officer.
