

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Apple Valley, Washington County, Utah that was held on the 5th day of January, 2012 at the Smithsonian Fire Department Building, 1777 N. Meadowlark Dr. Apple Valley, Utah.

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Moser.
3. Roll Call: Trevor Black, Roger Ashmore, Dale Kingsley, Kevin Sair, and Mayor Moser were present. Legal Counsel was excused. Code Enforcement Officer, April Ruesch was present. Town Clerk Nathan Bronemann took minutes.

4. Declarations of conflict of interests.

6. Swear in newly elected officials

Mayor Moser thanked Evan Brown for his service to the Town.

Mayor Moser swore in Kevin Sair, Trevor Black, and Roger Ashmore as Town Council members.

7. Presentation by Detective Situli Tafili of the Washington County Gang Taskforce

Detective Situli Tafili spoke about gang activity in the area. He said that there is a lot of gang activity here in Southern Utah. He said that there were more than 480 documented gang members here in So. Utah. Those include members of gangs such as Sureños, Norteños, Bloods, Crips, Banditos, White Supremacists, as well as many other smaller gangs. He said that most of the large gangs are overseen by gang bosses from the prisons. The gang members often leave cities such as Los Angeles to avoid being convicted under the three-strikes law. Some of these members end up in So. Utah. He told several stories of gang violence that has happened in the area.
