Class Description: Create this Springtime 16" x 20 " appliquéd wall quilt with a contemporary look, in just a few short hours. Three colorful small-print fabrics combine quickly with a scattering of fused appliquéd flowers and a bird. Perfect for beginning quilters. Easy techniques make fabulous results.

Supplies:

Please bring a sewing machine with straight stitch and free-motion feet. A basic sewing kit, including scissors, rotary tools and the following:

1 yd muslin or tear away stabilizer.

1 yd lite weight quilt bating (I like a cotton batting)

¼ yd. paper-backed fusible web (I like Heat n' Bond lite)

Spray starch

Monopoly thread (I like Superiors-Monopoly)

Fabrics:

Hint: *For best results use crisp, coordinating fabrics in simple two-color graphic prints in small (dime size) and larger (quarter or bigger) patterns. Think turquoise and orange... Lime green and fuschia pink...for a contemporary look. Coordinate your colors with the bird you choose.*

½ yd light to medium valued fabric : for background

¼ yd. darker valued fabric: *for wider bottom stripe*

Another ¼ yd fabric: *for the other bottom stripe*

8 x12" very light fabric scrap: *for area behind bird*

¼ yd of flowered fabric: *with flowers no larger then 3" in diameter*

1 fabric-printed bird: *no larger than 5" from tail to beak.*
