PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on the 12th day of January, A. D., 1918, there was issued a proclamation calling an election to be held in the town of Commerce, Ottawa County, Oklahoma, to submit the question of whether or not said town should become a city, and

WHEREAS, said proclamation was based upon a showing that the law had in all respects been complied with in the preliminaries and a certificate from the Secretary of the Election Board for Ottawa County has been filed with me showing that in the aforesaid election held on February 25, 1918, a majority of the votes cast in said election were affirmative on the question: "Shall Commerce become a city"?

NOW, THEREFORE, I, R. L. Williams, The Governor of the State of Oklahoma, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, do declare the result of the said election to be that the town of Commerce, Ottawa County, Oklahoma, has become a city, and that from and after this date it shall be vested with all the powers of such city under the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and cause to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Oklahoma, this the 4th day of March, A. D., 1918.
