## Materials

| Yardages based on 42" wide fabric |  |

| $7 / 8$ yd | Blue Thorny Floral (Y0461-32) |
| $1 / 4$ yd | Blue Dotty Floral (Y0462-32) |
| $3 / 8$ yd | Black Plaid (Y0460-3) |
| 1 yd | Blue Tonal (Y0459-32) |
| $1 / 2$ yd | Black Dotty Floral (Y0462-3) |
| $3 / 4$ yd | Black Tonal (Y0459-3) |
|  | (includes binding) |
| 2 yd | Blue Plaid (Y0460-32) |
| $3-1 / 2$ yd | Backing of Choice |

## Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

## From the Cream Stripe cut:

- $4-9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares on-point so that the stripes appear vertical in finished quilt.


## From Blue Thorny Floral cut:

- $9-9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares


## From the Blue Dotty Floral cut:

- 4-4-1/2" Circles for applique


## From the Black Plaid cut:

- $9-4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Circles for applique


## From the Blue Tonal cut:

- $2-14^{\prime \prime}$ squares, cut in half diagonally twice, to yield 8 triangles
- $2-7-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares, cut in half diagonally once, to yield 4 triangles
- 2 - 1-1/2" $\times 40-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- 2 - 1-1/2" x 44-5/8" strips
- $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 46-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips


## From the Black Dotty Floral cut:

- 2 - $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 38-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- 2 - 1-1/2" x 40-5/8" strips
- $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 46-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- 2 - 1-1/2" x 48-5/8" strips


## From the Black Tonal cut:

- 2 - 1-1/2" x 42-5/8" strips
- 2 - 1-1/2" $\times 44-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- $6-2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for binding


## From the Blue Plaid cut:

- $4-6^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF strips

## Directions

## Circle Blocks - Finished Size 91/2" square

1. Using the applique method of choice, center the Blue Dotty Floral circles in each Cream Stripe block and applique. Center the Black Plaid circles in each Blue Thorny Floral block and applique.

## Assemble the Quilt

1. Lay out the circle blocks on-point, beginning with 3 Black Plaid \& Blue Thorny Floral blocks in the first row and 2 Blue Dotty Floral \& Cream Stripe bocks in the second row. Add the Blue Tonal triangles around the edges to create the rectangular center of the quilt. Refer to the color picture on the front for placement.
2. Sew the quilt together in diagonal rows as shown in Diagram 1. The setting triangles are cut slightly larger than the blocks; trim edges of quilt to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance if necessary to make the quilt center $38-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 38-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square.
3. Add the borders as follows:

Border 1 = Black Dotty Floral, $2-11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 385 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips, $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 40-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
Border 2 = Blue Tonal, $2-1$ 1/2" $\times 405 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips, $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
Border 3 = Black Tonal, $2-1$ 1/2" x 42 5/8" strips, $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
Border 4 = Blue Tonal, $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips, $2-1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 46-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips
Border 5 = Black Dotty Floral, 1-1/2" x 46 5/8" strips, 2 - 1-1/2" $\times 48-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips Border $6=$ Blue Plaid, $4-6^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF strips, mitering the corners.
4. Layer quilt, batting \& backing. Quilt and bind as desired.

$41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ circle for appliqued blocks
