## French Country

## Materials

Yardages based on $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide fabric
7/8 yd Large Roosters
$5 / 8$ yd Rust Rooster Toile (inc. binding)
$1 / 3$ yd Blue Rooster Toile
$1 / 2$ yd Black Weather Vanes
1/8 yd Black Check
1-1/8 yd Backing of your choice, suggested Rooster Toss

## Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

## From the Large Roosters cut:

Fussy cut nine $7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, centering large images

## From the Rust Rooster Toile cut:

$4-2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for binding
$3-2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips cross cut into:
$40-2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares
From the Blue Rooster Toile cut:
$3-2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips cross cut into: $40-2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## From the Black Weather Vanes cut:

$1-7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strip, cut into
$8-7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
$3-2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips cut into
$8-2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## From the Black Check cut:

$1-2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strip, cut into: $2-2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles $2-2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## Directions

## Blocks with Sawtooth Borders

1. Take one $2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square each of Rust Rooster Toile and Blue Rooster Toile and place right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from the line on each side. (Fig.1)
Cut apart on the drawn line. Press. Trim each square to 2-1/4".

2. Repeat Step 1 for all of the $2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares for a total of 80 pieced squares.
3. Sew two of the pieced squares together, sewing along the blue edge. (Fig. 2)
4. Repeat step 3 for a total of 32 two-square units. There will be 16 square units left over.

Two-square unit
5. Sew two of the two-square units together along the rust edge for a total of 16 foursquare units. (Fig.3)
6. Sew a square unit to each end of 8 of the four-square units to make 8 six-square

Four-square unit units. Press the seams toward the end pieced squares. (Fig. 4)
7. Assemble a block by sewing a four-square unit to each side edge of a $7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Large Rooster square. Place the rust edge next to

Six-square unit the center square. Press the seams toward the center square. Sew a six-square unit to the top and bottom to complete the block. Repeat for a total of four framed Large Rooster blocks.

## Blocks with Black Weather Vanes Borders

1. Sew a $2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Black Weather Vanes rectangle to opposite sides of a $7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Large Rooster square. Press.
2. Sew a $2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to the top and bottom edges to complete the square. Press.
3. Repeat for a total of four framed Large Rooster squares.
4. Repeat steps 1 and 2 using the Black Check rectangles and the last Large Rooster square.

## Putting It Together

1. Sew three blocks together for the top row, using the quilt illustration as a guide. Sew the remaining blocks together to make the remaining horizontal rows.
2. Sew the three rows together to complete the quilt top.
3. Layer the top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired.
4. Bind and label the quilt to finish.
