5200 work area includes accessory storage space. An extrahigh presser foot lifter allows you a full height when sliding multiple layers of fabric and batting under the presser foot.

The Elna 5200 has a top loading bobbin with clear plastic bobbin cover. This allows you to easily check the amount of thread left on your bobbin, even if you are doing a large piece of work.

The extension table detaches for free-arm sewing. This machine features a sevenpiece feed mechanism, a drop feed facility, automatic needle threader, a slide speed control, and comes complete with a

hard cover to keep machine safe.

This is the perfect midrange machine for the quilter who wants great quilting features like needle up/down, good free motion capability, adjustable speed control, and lots of adjustable stitches. But, it's also good for garment sewing due to the free arm capability and many stitch options!




