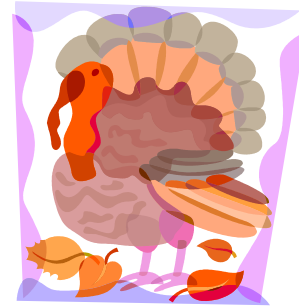

It has been very busy the last few months at the library with our new automation in full swing. Our circulation numbers are going through the roof! For those of you not familiar with all of the benefits of this service, let me tell you some of what is included. Not only is everything in our library automated, and available to be viewed online, but we are part of a consortium of other libraries in the state whose items are ALSO on line and available for check out. In the past we have been able to order items in for patrons, but with this new system, the patron (you) can go online and search for anything your heart desires, AND you can request it yourself to be sent to our library. When your items come in I give you a call, when you are done with them you return them to our library and we send them back. All at NO CHARGE to the patron. This is not limited to just books. Other items that our patrons have requested include:

Books on anything and everything

Audiobooks

Music CDs (yes, you read that right!)

Video (PC) games

Software for almost anything that you might want (we even have one citizen who is learning to speak Mandarin Chinese).

Playaway books

If you are not familiar with the Playaway systems, they are cartridges that come in with the book already audio recorded on them, all you have to do is plug in your headphones and you are set to go!

If you would like to search this statewide library catalog please visit seknfind.kohalibrary.com you can search without having to log in. If you want to order an item (or put it on hold as it's called), please contact the library and I will get an account set up for you so that you can start utilizing this service from home, or the library. And as always we can still order items for you if you prefer that method. Once you have your own account you can make purchase suggestions for our library, see what your past checkout history has been, renew items online...the possibilities are just endless. I certainly hope you'll consider using this service, it opens up the whole world to our small community of Longton, and I would be more than happy to explain any of it in detail who is interested.

We have also purchased new books this month...authors such as Janet Evanovich (including the newest Stephanie Plum series books), Zane Gray and Robert Conroy. We will soon have the new book "The Help" in for patron checkout and the new Bill O'Reilly book that is in hot demand "Killing Lincoln" is part of our new collection as well.
