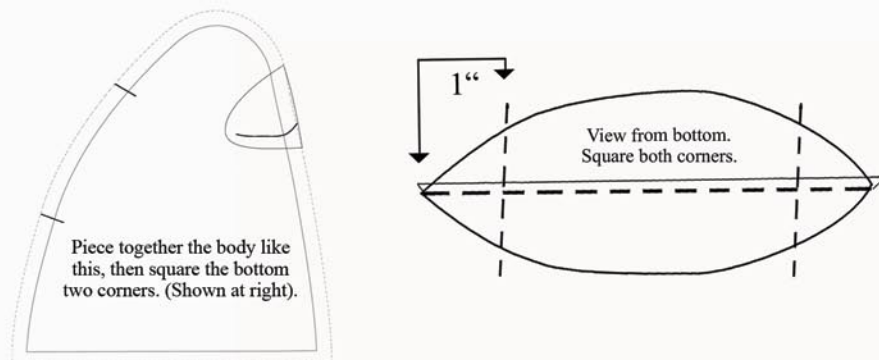


Corrections for Tweet Others with Kindness Book

Project: Little Tweet Pincushion, page 15

Add the following to *Step 4*, under *Piecing the Little Tweet*: (Do it before clipping the corners and turning the body right-side-out.)

To box one bottom corner of the bird body, line up the side seam with the bottom seam so it forms a point. Sew a straight seam approximately 1" from the corner. Repeat for the other bottom corner. Trim 1/4" from the seam to remove excess.



Clarification for the "Bird Watching Quilt"

Piecing Instructions for Birdhouses:

Birdhouse 1 (Page 7 of the book)

These instructions are for Birdhouse 1, but the same principles will be used on the other three birdhouses as well. The dimensions are all correct on the instructions in the book, but clarification was needed on how to line up the triangles when sewn together. The diagrams in the book reflect "centering" the (F4) triangles along the edge of the center rectangles, but instead, they should be skewed to one edge, leaving a large overhang on the top edge of the birdhouse. This may look a little funny at first, but it is correct, and it is what allows the "overhang" of the birdhouse roof. I hope this makes it clearer, but if you need further help, please feel free to contact us.

1. Sew one (F4) triangle to each of the long sides of one (E1) 6 1/8" x 7 1/2" rectangle, right sides together. You will not center the triangle along the long edge of (E1). Instead, you will overlap one corner of your (F4) triangle 1/4" beyond the BOTTOM edge (the corner closest to the (F3) piece) of the birdhouse rectangle (E1). There will be excess hanging over the top edge of (E1), and this is okay.
2. Line up the long edge of the (K1) triangle with the top edge of the (E1) block, right sides together. The points of the (K1) triangle should extend 1/4" beyond the edges of the (F4) triangles. Pin and sew. Before you press the seams, cut the excess points of the (F4) triangles even with the edges you just sewed. Press.
3. Line up the long edge of the (F3) triangle with the bottom edge of the (E1) block, right sides together. The points of the (F3) triangle should extend 1/4" beyond the edges of the (F4) triangles. Pin and sew. Press the seams. Clip all "wings" as shown, and square up your block to 10 1/2". Make 2. For the other three birdhouses, you can still follow the directions from the book, just be sure to line up the edges as you did in the directions above.
