Please read all instructions carefully before starting. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut from selvage to selvage unless otherwise stated.

Large Throw Instructions

approximate size: 62" x 72"

The quilt center is pieced first, then **Fabric A** rectangles are appliquéd on top. Use your favorite appliqué method - hand or fusible. If using the fusible method, follow the manufacturer's instructions and press the double-sided fusible web to the back side of **Fabric A**, then cut out the pieces as listed (includes no seam allowance). If hand appliquéing, add seam allowance enough to turn under.

1. Cut the following:

Fabric A - Cut 8 - 6" x 7", 2 - 10" x 15", 2 - 8" x 7", 2 - 4 1/4" x 7" and 1 - 3 1/4" x 7"

Fabric D - Borders - Cut 8 - 4" strips, sew end to end, then subcut 2 - 4" x 65" and 2 - 4" x 62"

Fabric E - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

Fabric F - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

Fabric G - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

Borders - Cut 7 - 2" strips, sew end to end, then subcut 2 - 2" x 62" and 2 - 2" x 55"

Fabric I - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

Fabric J - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

Borders - Cut 6 - 1 1/4" strips, sew end to end, then subcut 2 - 1 1/4" x 60 1/2" and 2 - 1 1/4" x 52"

BINDING - Cut 8 - 2 1/4" strips, sew end to end and press in half



Fabric N - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

Fabric P - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips



Fabric Q - Cut 3 - 5 1/2" strips

2. Piecing Order:


1. Make 3 of each of the following strip sets by sewing 5 1/2" strips side by side. Then subcut 15 - 5 1/2" segments from each strip set combination.




2. Sew segments together for 10" finished (10 1/2" unf.) 4-patches.



3. Sew 4-patches together into vertical rows, then sew rows together according to the diagram. Notice that each vertical row consists of 2 different 4-patches that are alternated.





4. Next, place **A** rectangles over the quilt center and appliqué in place according to the diagram. For hand appliqué, turn edges under or if using fusible web, iron in place, then machine stitch a blanket or satin stitch to cover the edges.
5. Sew **J** 1 1/4" x 60 1/2" to the **SIDES** of the quilt, then sew **J** 1 1/4" x 52" to the **TOP** and **BOTTOM**.
6. Sew **G** 2" x 62" to the **SIDES** of the quilt, then sew **G** 2" x 55" to the **TOP** and **BOTTOM**.
7. Sew **D** 4" x 65" to the **SIDES** of the quilt, then sew **D** 4" x 62" to the **TOP** and **BOTTOM**.
8. The Large Throw measures approximately 62" x 72". Make backing (**Fabric E**) at least 8" larger than the top. Layer and baste top, batting and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric J**) and enjoy!!

Fabric B - Cut lengthwise 2 - 6 3/4" x 47 1/2"

Fabric C - Cut 2 - 9 7/8" strips subcut 6 - 9 7/8"


squares, cut in half diagonally, 3  and 3 , for 12 triangles

Fabric G - Cut 1 - 9 7/8" strip, subcut 4 - 9 7/8"

squares, cut in half diagonally for 8 triangles

Cut 1 - 5 3/8" strip, subcut 6 - 5 3/8" squares, cut in half for 12 triangles 

BINDING - Cut 7 - 2 1/4" strips, sew end to end and press in half

Fabric H - Cut 2 - 5 3/8" strips, subcut 12 - 5 3/8" squares, cut in half diagonally for 24 triangles 


Fabric I - Cut 7 - 3" strips, sew end to end, then subcut
2 - 3" x 60" and 2 - 3" x 52 1/2"

Fabric J - Cut 2 - 2 1/2" strips, subcut 4 - 2 1/2" x 9 1/2"
and 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Cut 2 - 1 1/2" strips, subcut 20 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Cut 1 - 9 1/2" strip, subcut 4 - 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" and 8 - 1 1/2" x 5 1/2"

Fabric K - Cut 5 - 1 1/2" strips, sew end to end, then subcut 2 - 1 1/2" x 45 1/2" and 2 - 1 1/2" x 47 1/2"

Fabric L - Cut 2 - 9 7/8" x 9 7/8" squares, cut in half diagonally for 4 triangles 

Fabric M - Cut 1 - 5" strip, subcut 8 - 5" squares

Cut 2 - 6 7/8" strips, subcut 9 - 6 7/8" squares



Fabric O - Cut 2 - 2 1/2" strips, subcut 16 - 2 1/2" squares and 4 - 2 1/2" x 3 1/2"

Fabric P - Cut 1 - 2 1/2" strip, subcut 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" (doors) and 8 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" (windows)


2. Piecing Order:

1. Make 4 - 9" finished (9 1/2" unf.) House Blocks.


Make roof section by first drawing a diagonal line on the back side of 8 **Fabric O** 2 1/2" squares. Next, place an **O** 2 1/2" square over both corners of 4 **J** 2 1/2" x 9 1/2", right sides together and matching raw edges. Pay attention to the direction of the diagonal lines according to the diagram. Stitch ON the diagonal line, trim 1/4" from seam and press outward.




2. Make the following 9" finished (9 1/2" unf.) blocks by sewing **G** and **H** 5 3/8" triangles around **M** 6 7/8" squares according to the diagrams. Sew triangles to opposite sides first. Press. Then sew triangles to the remaining sides.



3. Make 4 - 9" finished (9 1/2" unf.) blocks by sewing **L** and **C** 9 7/8" triangles together. Pay attention to the direction of **Fabric C** print. Refer to the quilt for correct positioning.



4. Make 8 - 9" finished (9 1/2" unf.) blocks. First, sew **C** and **G** 9 7/8" triangles together. Pay attention to the positioning of **Fabric C** print in each unit. Next, draw a diagonal line on the back side of 8 **M** 5" squares. Place one **M** 5" square on **G** triangles, right sides together and match corners. Pay attention to the direction of the diagonal line according to the diagram. Stitch ON the diagonal line, trim 1/4" from the seam and press outward.



5. Sew blocks together into rows, then sew rows together for the quilt center according to the diagram. **Fabric C** is directional so pay special attention to the direction of the blocks according to the cover picture.

6. Sew **K** 1 1/2" x 45 1/2" to the SIDES, then sew **K** 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" to the quilt's TOP and BOTTOM.

7. Sew **B** 6 3/4" x 47 1/2" to the TOP and BOTTOM of the quilt.

8. Sew **I** 3" x 60" to the SIDES, then sew **I** 3" x 52 1/2" to the TOP and BOTTOM.

9. The Wall Quilt measures approximately 52 1/2" x 65". Make the backing (**Fabric P**) at least 8" larger than the top. Layer and baste top, batting and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric G**) and enjoy!!
