Next steps for Village of Downs

- Complete sewer construction
 - Finalize and approve ordinances governing sewer use
 - Rules for connections
 - Fee schedule
 - Should be completed at August, September and October meetings
- Finalize agreement with Bloomington-Normal Water Reclamation District (BNWRD) for pre-annexation
- System go-live and residents notified to connect

Next steps for village residents

(Following notification to connect)

- > Apply for permit
 - BNWRD connection fee paid
 - Permit granted
- > Hire contractor to make sewer connection
- Notify village that connection is ready
 - Connection inspected by village for illegal in-flow
 - Permission given to connect
- Village begins billing for sewer service

Why the sewer system is good for Downs

- Environmental Protection Agency was threatening the village with fines over sewer discharge
 - Threatened fines as much as \$10,000 per day
- Sewer system will make Downs and Downs Crossing more attractive to future development
 - New business will increase tax revenue
 - Tax revenue can be used to improve roads and water
- Existing storm water tile system is contaminated with sewage, causing sewage backup into some homes when flooding occurs
- > Better for the local environment
 - Currently raw waste is discharged into Kickapoo Creek and watershed, raising health concerns

Why the sewer is good for residents

- Connecting to the sewer will provide safe waste disposal and eliminate septic tank backups
- Sewer eliminates the need for septic tank maintenance, such as pumping
- Cost of septic tank repair and replacement can be much higher than cost of connecting to sewer
- Lack of septic tank can make home more attractive to potential buyers
