Mayoral Update

November 7, 2011

Dear citizens,

We have had an absolutely beautiful fall and the good weather has allowed finishing work on the sewer to progress nicely. The very difficult bore under Interstate 74 is finally complete and all of the sewer pipe is installed. Pressure testing and the televising of the pipe will begin in the next few weeks. Televising of the existing sewer pipe in Mallard Subdivision will be performed this week to insure pipe has not lost any integrity over the years and that it will perform properly once connected to the entire system. We do not yet have a final date when homeowners and businesses will be able to begin connecting. Every home and business will be receiving a letter of readiness to connect to the system.

There is no doubt our Village roads have taken a beating during the sewer construction and we have been addressing this with the engineers and contractors. The potholes to the immediate North and South of the railroad viaduct on Huff Road will be completed with hot mix asphalt this fall to smooth out the potholes and settling. A new cover of seal coat will be completed in the spring. Unfortunately, there were issues out of control that caused too much delay to fully complete Huff Road this fall. The plants that supply the oil for spray patch and seal coat work have closed their operations for the year.

Our garbage collection company, Casali and Son's, attended our meeting to propose a new recycling schedule, which would add an extra day of picking up recycling. We will keep you updated as to the possibility of the additional day and schedule change for recycling pickup. Casali stated that roughly only 30% of the homes are recycling and they would like to see 75% participation in recycling. I encourage everyone in the Village to use our curbside recycling service. If we can all reduce the amount of garbage going to the transfer station we can keep future garbage collection fees to a minimum.

The Village Board discussed Farmland subdivision's road at the last few board meetings and the Board is working with the developer to have the road completed as soon as possible.

Please read the November finance report in the flyer. As of 10/31/11 the total funds for the Village has increased 340% from May2009! I am very proud that even in the awful economic times of our state and nation, our current Village Board has been very fiscally responsible and able to maintain a healthy financial reserve for our Village. Over the last few years, we have adopted numerous intergovernmental Agreements with other municipalities that has created unique partnerships and significant cost savings. These arrangements of local partnerships are crucial for small governmental entities such as Downs and I look forward to more successful partnerships in the future.

Finally, I would like to inform you of a new job title for a Village employee. With the completion of our new sewer system and our ongoing infrastructure needs, the Village Board has approved a position of Public Works Superintendent. This position will allow us to properly maintain our sewer system, improve our water quality, continue to make improvements on our roads and be the most cost-effective way to accomplish all three critical infrastructures for our Village.

Street Report For October 2011

Fall weather wraps up another season of street repair and we have had a lot!

We have been scrambling to get as much of the sewer street repair completed as possible this fall. However, we will fall short of getting everything completed. Next spring we will finish up the remaining punch list streets items for Huff, Cleveland, Kickapoo, Franklin, Fox Run, Lincoln, Gadwall and possibly others.

Sidewalk work was completed last month as we attempt to wrap up all the bad spots in town and work toward sprucing up Seminary Street at little each year. New street signs are starting to go up around town and we still hope to complete the installation of all our new signs that we had ordered this fall.

Snow removal preparation is taking place. The Streets Department will be doing all of our snow plowing this year, which will allow us full control over the work being done. I realize that there are different ways to plow and always different ideas on how it should be done. I expect this to be a rather interesting year and hope to have the cooperation of all residents for helping make transition as easy as possible.

Snow removal will start at ~2" and will focus getting one pass through all streets before widening and cleanup is done. Cars parked along the side of the roads will slow this process down. Please park your cars in your driveway during days where we are expecting 4"+ of snow or high winds. Once removal is completed we will come back through and spread salt. We still could use a few more backup drivers. If you are interested please email or call me immediately.

During the fall we all have to deal with leaves, brush and fall cleanup. I am still not where I want to be in this regard with helping and providing a healthier way for cleanup. Please do not put or burn this in ditches or in front of culverts in order to keep the debris from washing into the culverts and causing problems downstream or with your neighbor (This is against village ordinances). I do appreciate all the help and support with keeping Downs looking great by picking up litter, keeping ditches clean and mowed.

Village of Downs Financial Report, November 2011

The end of October marks the 6th month into the fiscal year and time for a brief update from the Finance Committee. The sewer project is near completion with homeowners and businesses ready to connect. Did we think we would ever reach this historic point in time? The Village Board with direction from Treasurer Cuba has maintained a close and watchful eye overseeing sewer disbursement checks and overall sewer project finances. I am pleased the Village was able to offer a low interest financing option to assist our citizens with BNWRD costs. The paperwork loan process with citizens went smoothly and re-payment processes are in motion.

Sales Tax

The Village of Downs continues to be challenged financially accruing less sales tax dollars which have been slower than anticipated. Income tax receipts are three months late and approaching \$18,000 that is due the Village. A payment received in September was vouchered in June.

Water Fund

Challenges remain, with some line items over budget; however, the overall budget is not. Water line breaks and hydrant replacements have strained the budget, but are maintenance necessities.

Motor Fuel

Motor Fuel is close to spending all of the budgeted dollars allocated; however this is typical for this time of year. Due to cash flow issues we have borrowed from SAS since the income into Motor Fuel has not all been received as it comes in on a monthly basis.

Budgets

Over the next six months the finance committee will continue to closely monitor line items so notto exceed budgets. General Fund Cash Balance for 4/30/2011 is \$82471.53 in comparison to \$48796.35 for 4/30/2010. The Village maintains various bank accounts. As of April 30, 2011 total cash and cash equivalent accounts was \$699,495; April 20, 2010 was \$424,558 on the books. *Line 513Vehicle Maintenance* is over because Police needed maintenance performed on the squad car. *Line 655Fuel* is over the 50% mark, but mowing should be done for the season with less gasoline costs. We will continue to closely watch sewer project dollars. We need to build up our reserves. Unlike state government, as local officials, we will need to continue making hard decisions and living within our means to balance our budgets every year.

Future Goals

With the completion of the sewer project, the Village needs to focus attention on economic growth and development. A task force should be formed and involve citizens. In addition, the board needs to consider upgrades to the Village Hall to make this facility a community hub for governmental business that is accessible to all citizens, and a welcome center to this community. It is therefore, my proposal to the mayor and board of trustees to consider using TIF and SAS funds to build a handicap ramp and a few other minor structural upgrades to make this public use facility both functional and accessible and compliant with ADA regulations to meet the future goals of this Village. We cannot afford to wait any longer to accomplish these much needed renovations.

I am honored to serve as the Finance Trustee. A special thanks to our Treasurer Janice Cuba for her leadership and guidance throughout the sewer project and overseeing the day to day financial complexities related to Village finances. Submitted by Maureen Roach, Finance Trustee

26th-30th of the month: Shut offs will be done for non-payment

Shut-offs: Payments are to be paid at the Village Hall and not to the person turning the water off. Should your service be shut off, a turn on fee of \$30 is needed in addition to the outstanding balance. Service will not resume until the next business day that payment is posted.

Payments and NSF Checks: PAYMENTS NEED TO BE MADE USING THE VILLAGE PO BOX OR THE DROPBOX. VILLAGE EMPLOYEES ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR GETTING YOUR PAYMENT TO THE VILLAGE HALL. Those using on-line payment services need to be sure the service is sending the check in advance of the due date of the 20th. THE VILLAGE DOES NOT RECEIVE DIRECT TRANSFERS. NSF checks cost the customer and the Village. The Village is charged a fee by the bank for each NSF check. The Village charges the customers with an NSF check fee of \$25, and then re-payment by the customer needs to be done in cash.

Water Emergencies such as no water or water leaking need to be reported to Jeff Misch at 275-3793. The water trustee is Mike Freimann and he can be reached at 378-1538.

Hydrant Flushing will be November 15, 16, 17 from 9:00-12:00 noon. Evening flushing has been discontinued due to high water usage in the evenings.

Water Meters and Transmitters are the property of the Village of Downs. Please contact Village Hall for any maintenance needs. Tampering with this equipment is against Village of Downs Ordinances.

Loan Payments: For those wanting to apply additional payments to their BNWRD Fee Loan need to be sure and include a note with their payment so the payment can be applied correctly.

Sewer Connection: When property owners are allowed to connect to the sewer system, please keep in mind that gutters and sump pumps are not permitted to drain into the system.



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
