Sewer –Most of the administrative items for the Sewer Project were finalized this month. A letter will be sent to all property owners in the next 30 days outlining the process to obtain a permit for installation of the sewer service connection.

Living Hope Church- will be submitting paperwork to the Zoning Board of Appeals to annex property into the Village of Downs to build a multi-purpose facility.

SPEED LIMIT CHANGE

In November of 2009, the Village Board passed an ordinance to **lower the Village speed limit to 25 mph** (Chapter 8, Article IV, Section 4). Implementation would happen as signs were replaced due to Federal MUTCD code changes. We are now ready to start replacing these signs. We will start on the West side of town in Mallard Point, at the suggestion of our Police Chief, and work our way back across town. The signs will be marked with red flags, for several weeks, to draw attention to this change.

Mayoral Update

January 7, 2012

Dear citizens,

In February every homeowner should receive their letter explaining the connection process for the sewer system. At our January board meeting, your village board passed the final administrative ordinance pertaining to the sewer system. We are in the process of fine tuning the final steps in this multi-year and multi-million dollar sewer system. With the timing of our project, we were able to take advantage of both state and federal stimulus funding, it will cost each of us much less than similar communities installing infrastructure of this magnitude. Our 11 year, \$11 million project, the loans we did need are 0% loans that have 25% principal forgiveness, saving us millions over the life of the loan.

I know many of you have had questions regarding the financials of this project and here is the financial breakdown and where all the funds were derived:

- 1. Engineering design and construction
- 2. Three phases of sewer installation
- 3. Cornbelt Energy for pump station

These three components totaled roughly \$10.8 million in costs. The village received a last minute Build Illinois grant of \$3.8 million that does not have to be repaid. This grant also provided another \$1.6 million in principal forgiveness from our loan. This leaves the remaining \$5.3 millionin a 0% interest 20 year loan.

We have been interviewing candidates for the Public Works Superintendent position. This person will be devoting their time to the water plant operation, sewersystem monitoring and maintenance and street department work. Their immediate task will be devoted to improving the quality of water and maintenance of equipment to decrease the probability of more boil orders due to mechanical repairs. We know as a board that basic services such as water and roads are what residents expect from their local government. The results of the water quality survey on the village website(www.villageofdowns.org) made it clear that the water quality is one area of our infrastructure we must improve.

I want to personally thank Trustee Mike James and members of Downs Township for their hours of dedication in planning, improving and maintaining the village road ways.

Please read the reports from the trustees in this month's flyer as they pertain to important issues for all citizens.

- 1. A phone notification system that the village is utilizing with the school district (Thank you Tri-Valley CUSD#3 and Mr. Pearson).
- 2. Detailing snow plowing and speed limit reduction through town
- 3. Sewer system connection information

Sewer Update January 2012

The Village of Downs' and its engineering firm, Farnsworth Group, continue to finalize details before opening the new village sewer collection system to homeowners. Homeowners should expect to get the sewer connection packet from the village by the end of February.

At January's meeting, the board approved the part of the sewer ordinance that set the rates residents will pay for the sewer.

- As previously mentioned, the rate will include a portion that all households in the village will be assessed for the cost of construction and operation and maintenance of the system.
 - This portion of the fee for will be \$22 per month, broken down as follows:
 - \$17 for payment of the zero-percent interest loan (\$5.3 million financed); this replaces the current \$15 sewer charge (a net increase of \$2 per month)
 - \$5 for operation, maintenance and repair
- o Once homes are connected to the sewer system, they will be billed as follows:
 - \$0.98per 1,000 gallons of metered water use assessed by the village
 - \$1.63per 1,000 gallons of metered water use assessed by Bloomington-Normal Water Reclamation District
- The village will send a letter to residents telling them they may begin connecting to the system
 - We anticipate this letter being sent during February 2012.
 - The letter will include an application for connection.
 - Residents will have approximately 180 days to connect (or provide proof that they are exempt from connection by virtue of a valid septic permit and no current connection to the system).
 - There will be a permit fee of \$85 assessed to cover the cost of the inspection when the service is ready for final connection

Homeowners are responsible for hiring a contractor to make the connection for their home to the provided stub into the sewer system.

- This cost is the responsibility of the homeowner
- Final connection cannot be made unless inspected by a village representative

Chapter 12 of the Village of Downs Ordinances

1st of the month:

All accounts are charged for the prior month's service

15th-18th of the month:

Meters are read

20th of the month: 21st of the month:

All accounts are due in full from the billing sent on the 1st

Late penalties are added and shut off notices are sent out.

26th-30th of the month: Shut offs will be done for non-payment

Shut-offs: Payments are to be paid at the Village Hall and not to the person turning the water off. Should your service be shut off, a turn on fee of \$30 is needed in addition to the outstanding balance. Service will not resume until the next business day that payment is posted.

Payments and NSF Checks: PAYMENTS NEED TO BE MADE USING THE VILLAGE PO BOX OR THE DROPBOX. VILLAGE EMPLOYEES ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR GETTING YOUR PAYMENT TO THE VILLAGE HALL. Those using on-line payment services need to be sure the service is sending the check in advance of the due date of the 20th. THE VILLAGE DOES NOT RECEIVE DIRECT TRANSFERS. NSF checks cost the customer and the Village. The Village is charged a fee by the bank for each NSF check. The Village charges the customers with an NSF check fee of \$25, and then re-payment by the customer needs to be done in cash.

Water Emergencies such as no water or water leaking need to be reported to Jeff Misch at 275-3793. The water trustee is Mike Freimann and he can be reached at 378-1538.

Water Meters and Transmitters are the property of the Village of Downs. Please contact Village Hall for any maintenance needs. Tampering with this equipment is against Village of Downs Ordinances.

Should you need to make payment arrangements; those will now need to be made in writing at the Village Hall. Hours are 8-12 noon Monday through Friday.

Street Report For December 2011

Winter is officially here, but you certainly wouldn't know it from the unseasonable weather we have been having. I must say that God has been very good to us in our first full year of doing our own snow plowing.

Because of this, we have been able to do dry runs and one live run to test our routes and find additional troublespots. These spots have been marked with reflectors, etc. Please do not remove these reflectors and please help by watching and reporting where they have been removed. Many hours have been spent preparing our trucks, drivers, equipment and routes for when the snow really falls.

We will continue to salt as needed and will continue to do practice runs with small accumulations, etc. I said this back in November but will restate it again: I realize that there are different ways to plow and different ideas on how it should be done, but we are drawing from the knowledge of experienced drivers. I hope to have the cooperation of all residents for helping make this transition as easy as possible and will do our best accomdate special requests. The best way to assist us is by removing, if possible, any cars parked along the edge of the road during times when we are clearing the roads.

We are working to finish replacing all regulatory signs with the new MUTCD Federal Standard signs. All stop signs have been replaced and most of the weight limit signs have been replaced or implemented. If you have a business in town and will be operating vehicle(s) above the posted Village weight limits, then you must complete, yearly, a free permit to exceed posted Village weight limit. This permit application can be gotten from the Village website or Village Hall and returned to the Village Hall to my attention.

Also, we will be changing the speed limit signs over the next month on the west side of town, at the request/suggestion of our police chief. Mallard Point and Main Street will see the posted speed limit reduced to 25 mph per ordinance Chapter 8 Article IV Section 4. These speed limit signs will have red flags on them to help draw attention to where these changes have been implemented.

Finally, the Village Board approved the purchase of a tractor and loader for the Streets Department. This is another big step forward in bringing all our Village maintenance back inhouse and provide further long-run savings to our Village. To date, we have saved money by using inter-governmental agreements, part-time employees, volunteers, snow plowing, salting, chipping and providing resources for mowing.




