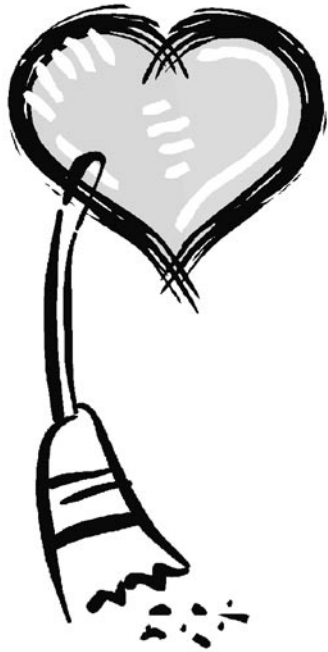
## Christmas in July

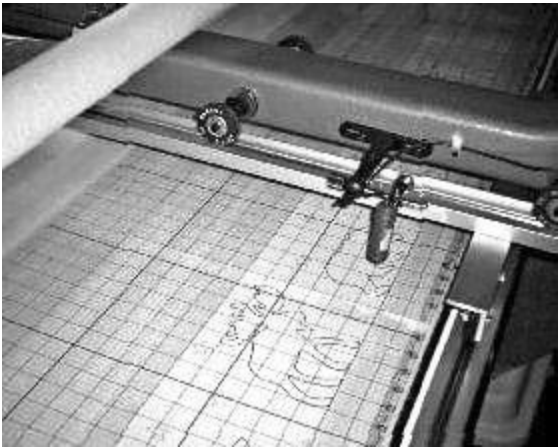


## Heart of Colorado Shop Hop

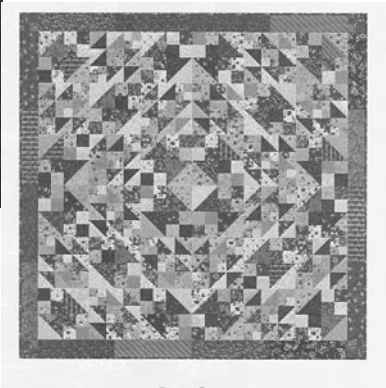


## PAPER DOLLS

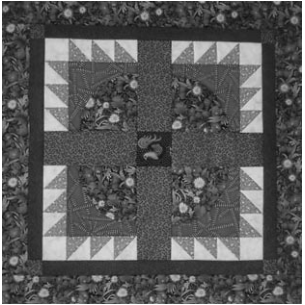
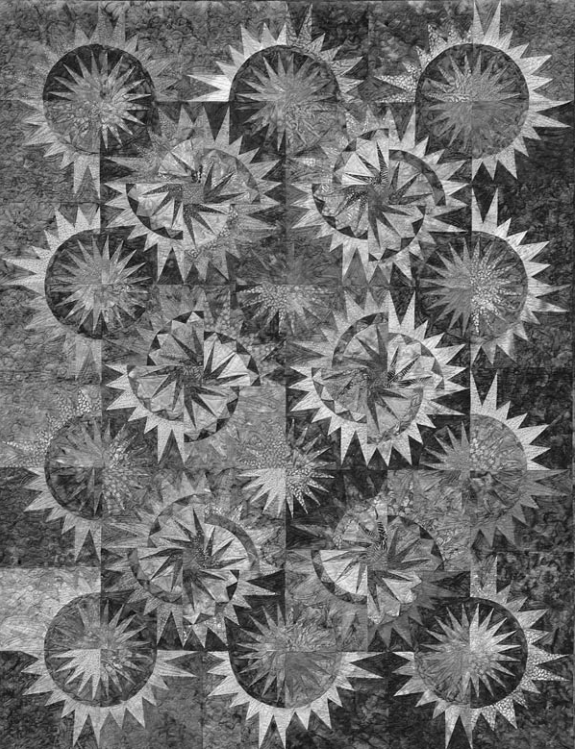


### Friday Afternoon Strippers

There are always plenty of pre-cut strip bundles available for purchase, or you may bring your own strips. A different pattern will be featured each month to help you use those strips! Class cost is FREE with featured monthly pattern purchase.

# Technique Classes



### Scrappy Bears Path

Marti Michell of machine quilting fame has developed great sets of templates to help rotary cut fabrics accurately and without waste. This brand new design, the Scrappy Bears Path, was unveiled at October’s Quilt Market, and Natalie was lucky enough to attend her class. The “Path” comes from the combination of the Bear’s Paw and Drunkard’s Path blocks, all done with easy rotary cutting and machine piecing. You simply will not believe how easy this pattern is to cut and piece and how fast the top will go together. The rotary cutting templates are such a big help, but are not required to create this quilt.

### Cotton Theory Quilting: Button Back Table Runner

You will be so impressed with this creative “quilt first-then assemble method”! All Cotton Theory projects have a unique three dimensional look and all are totally reversible. In class we will make a small button back table runner; a great accent for spring or for any time of year. Once you have completed this project, you are ready for any of the other patterns and projects available from Cotton Theory.



### Fourth of July

This basically batik block of the month is paper pieced. You say you have tried paper piecing and don’t like it? You love the look of the pointy-est. of points but hate removing all that paper after you’re done sewing? Well let me teach you the freezer paper piecing method! We will be completing this wonderful quilt, one block at a time, while learning a great new way to get those precise points. We will be offering this quilt in rich jewel tones for a beautiful, warm look. This quilt will be stunning!



### Beginner Hand Appliqué

For this class “beginner” means the ability to use scissors and perhaps to thread a needle! Gloria has put together an easy class for the “beginner-beginner”! She will cover the very basic techniques used to create templates, inside and outside curves and points, stems, leaves, and more.

## Quick Tips

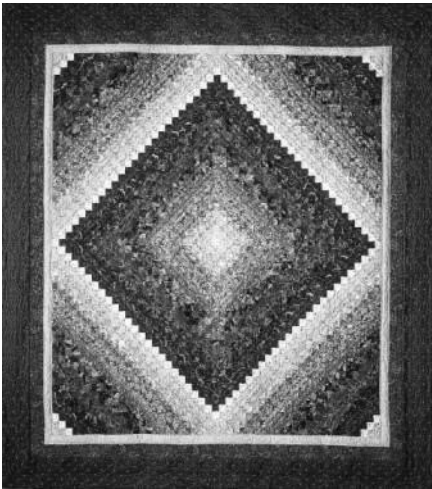
**Organize Blocks:** Purchase medium to large size pizza boxes from your local pizza place. They are great for storing quilt blocks and are easy to stack and keep organized. This works especially well for blocks that have a lot of bias cuts in them, as frequent handling can cause distortion.

**Scissors Keeper:** Attach an acrylic suction cup hook on the side of the sewing machine to hang small scissors or thread clippers

**Organize Needles:** Divide a tomato pincushion into sections by labeling one needle size per section. You can do one for sewing machine needles too!

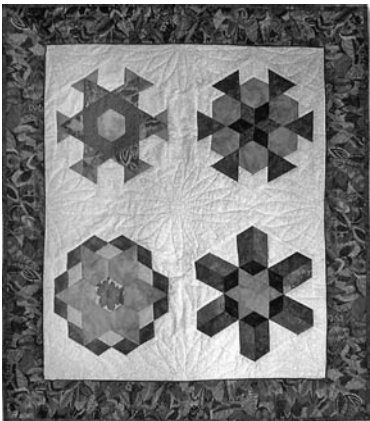
## Colorsplash Trip Around the World

This quick method of cutting and sewing gives you the opportunity to construct a uniquely beautiful quilt in a very short period of time. The quick method combined with the popular “watercolor” look creates a breathtaking design that receives rave reviews! Fabric kits are available, but you may pick your

own fabrics. We’ll help if you want us to. Please allow a minimum of two hours to choose the fabrics (three to four hours is more realistic). The quilt is totally rotary cut and machine sewn. Previous rotary cutting and machine piecing experience required. We assume you have basic quilting skills.

## Perfect Beginnings

We have the perfect class for you to begin your journey into quilting, or simply to sharpen those skills you may have let get just a little rusty. It’s all done by hand, so no machine required. We start at the very basic levels, so no experience required, either. Natalie will guide you gently through the processes of choosing fabrics, hand piecing, hand appliqué, and hand quilting. You’ll also learn those vital steps to apply a border and binding so that your quilt lies flat and square. Have fun and learn all of the basics that you need to start quilting.



## Machine Quilting

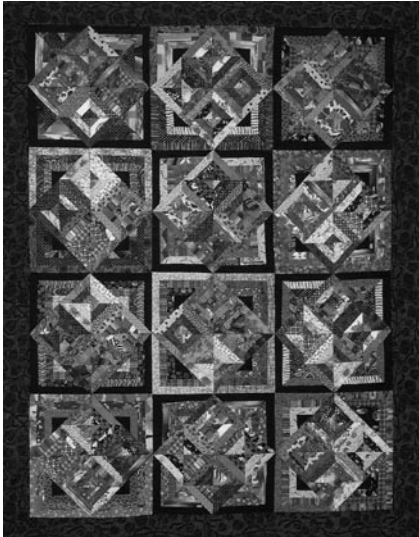
Finish those projects! Machine quilting makes fast and easy work of finishing quilts, quilted clothing, placemats, table runners, wall quilts, etc. Based on Harriet Hargrave’s book, *Heirloom Machine Quilting*, our Machine Quilting class covers basic machine quilting, using your machine’s walking foot (even-feed foot), and free-motion quilting.

## The Hidden Star Sampler

The Hidden Star Sampler, by Applewood Farm Publications is an exciting new approach to learning the basics of quilt construction while making a gorgeous sampler quilt. This class will be an in-depth study covering the basics of quilting.

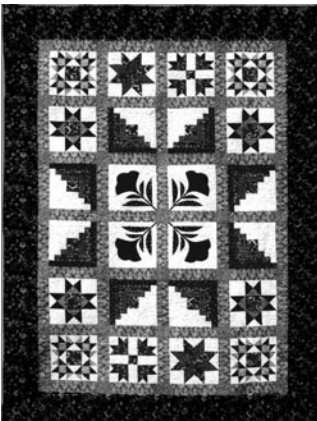
## Bouillabaisse

Do you have a lot of batiks in your stash? This is the quilt for you! Come and enjoy the day with us while making this striking quilt. We will be offering a “strip exchange” in order to gather some different batiks to add to your stash to make this very “crazy” quilt a little crazier! If you want to participate, bring ten extra batik strips to exchange. Isn’t the name an inspiration? We think so! If you would like to join us for the day, bring a finger food to share and we will provide the drinks!



## Machine Quilting without the Bulk

This is an advanced beginner level of Machine Quilting. We all know that pushing the bulk of a large quilt through the small opening in a home sewing machine is one of the things that makes quilting bed-sized quilts difficult for the home quilter. You’ll be amazed at the quilts you can finish when you reduce your quilting bulk. Note: Previous experience with machine quilting required.

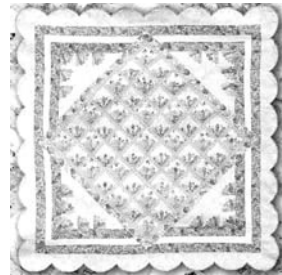


## Baby Quilts

Jean will teach you how to make some easy Dresden plate fans, sash and set them on point, surround them with a few borders, and finish with a very pretty scallop edge. We assume that you have basic garment construction skills when signing up for this class.

## Take 12 Jacket

What a great design! This light weight jacket will be your favorite for the chilly Colorado nights! It is made using 12 fat quarters of your choosing and just begs to be embellished with buttons, machine or hand embroidery or some special quilting. Just let your imagination take charge!



# Featured Classes



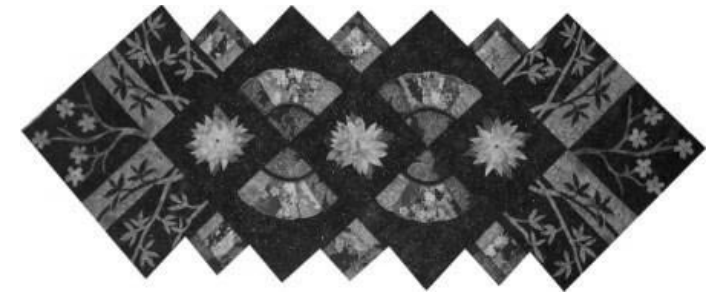
## In Full Bloom

McKenna Ryan has designed the wonderful garden we all wish we could grow, with masses of beautiful blossoms creating a sanctuary around a sweet little cottage. You can bring this gorgeous art quilt home and give yourself the beauty without all the work of the actual garden. We have designed a Block of the Month class around this quilt, so you'll have to complete only one block at a time—a very do-able project.



## George

You've asked for classes on George, so how could we refuse? George is the longarm quilting machine in a desk. Use your established free-motion quilting skills on a true twenty-inch deep longarm. Free yourself from the constraints of quilting on a home machine and discover how easy it is to finish your quilts! We expect you to have some free-motion experience for this class, because we're going to concentrate on using George and doing as much stitching as we can! Class size will be limited to just three or four students so everyone gets maximum time with our new best friend. Bring a small quilt-top, batting and backing (no larger than crib size; about 40" by 50" please).



## Asian Breeze Tablerunner

You have eagerly awaited Mt. Redoubt's new tablerunners, and now they're ready, and we're going to have a class to boot! These patterns are elegant and fun to do, and they look so much harder than they are—you'll fall in love with the patterns and the techniques, and you'll want to make one in each colorway (we do). Natalie will guide you step-by-step to your own delightful dimensional Asian Breeze Tablerunner.

## Quilted Letters Wall Hanging

'Tis the season for weddings and graduations. And what a perfect technique to use for these and many other special occasions. You will find that making your own bias is not difficult, and the results are definitely worth the extra time it takes. Jean will guide you through all of the ins and outs of creating your own very personal Celtic masterpiece. Sure to please all the special "someone's on your list."



## Tree of Life

Diamonds with no 'Y' seams? How can it be? With Nancy Johnson-Srebro's method, it not only is possible but actually easy! Learn this technique while making an attractive 'tree of life' block. What a wonderful wall hanging or center medallion for a king size quilt. Maybe diamonds really are a girl's best friend!



## Silk Purse

Mary Jo Hiney has made some simply wonderful patterns and kits for silk projects. She has collected her silks into lovely color groups, making it so easy to get spectacular color without the work. Natalie fell in love with this pattern when she attended a class at Fall Market, and she wanted to bring it home to you. The silks are gorgeous and we think you'll agree this stunning chrysanthemum bag is a great way to use them! You can easily substitute cottons for the silk if you wish.
