

Colorsplash Trip Around the World


This quick method of cutting and sewing gives you the opportunity to construct a uniquely beautiful quilt in a very short period of time. The quick method combined with the popular "watercolor" look creates a breathtaking design that receives rave reviews! Fabric kits are available, but you may pick your own fabrics. We'll help if you

want us to. Please allow a minimum of two hours to choose the fabrics (three to four hours is more realistic). The quilt is totally rotary cut and machine sewn. Previous rotary cutting and machine piecing experience required. We assume you have basic quiltmaking skills.



Beginner Hand Appliqué

For this class "beginner" means the ability to use scissors and perhaps to thread a needle! Gloria has put together an easy class for the "beginner-beginner"! She will cover the very basic techniques used to create templates, inside and outside curves and points, stems, leaves, and more.




Seams Raggy

Back by popular demand! We have recieved many requests for this class, so her it is. This is a beginner level quilt by Four Corners. The quilt is made up of one basic block and sews up beautifully with flannels. What a perfect project for those chilly winter nights. The really great feature of this throw is that when you are done, you are done! No quilting or binding needed. What a great weekend project! Come in and see for yourself.



Links


Reminiscent of bargello needlework, Links is a very dramatic looking pattern designed by Dereck Lockwood. Though the pattern looks difficult, it is all strip pieced and color coded. Jean will guide you through sewing and unsewing the panels, rearranging, and finally in assembling your quilt top. You will end up with a 48" x 66" masterpiece. Come and join the excitement.



| Celtic Hearts

Most of us who quilt enjoy making items to decorate our homes for the seasons. We also love to simplify our lives. Learn a technique to make your own easy bias tape, which will allow you to focus on the fun and creativity of the designs and use any color

you want for your bias. Curved designs are no longer a scary thought. You will be able quilt this heart design in no time.



The Hidden Star Sampler

The Hidden Star Sampler, by Applewood Farm Publications is an exciting new approach to learning the basics of quilt construction while making a gorgeous sampler quilt. This class will be an in-depth study covering the basics of quiltmaking.

Perfect Beginnings

We have the perfect class for you to begin your journey into quilting, or simply to sharpen those skills you may have let get just a little rusty. It's all done by hand, so no machine required. We start at the very basic levels, so no experience required, either. Natalie will guide you gently through the processes of choosing fabrics, hand piecing, hand appliqué, and hand quilting. You'll also learn those vital steps to apply a border and binding so that your quilt lies flat and square. Have fun and learn all of the basics that you need to start quilting.



Machine Quilting

Finish those projects! Machine quilting makes fast and easy work of finishing quilts, quilted clothing, placemats, table runners, wall quilts, etc. Based on Harriet Hargrave's book, *Heirloom Machine Quilting*, our Machine Quilting class covers basic machine quilting, using your machine's walking foot (evenfeed foot), and free-motion quilting.

Quick Tips

Washing Small Pieces: When washing small pieces of fabrics or fat quarters, place fabrics in a mesh lingerie bag and zip closed. Add bag to the washing machine along with your other clothing items, or wash alone in a sink of water. You will notice minimal fraying and you won't lose those little scraps of fabric!

Portable design wall: Purchase an inexpensive flannel backed vinyl tablecloth at a discount store, or buy flannel backed vinyl at the fabric store. Pin your "design wall" to the wall, or hang it near the ceiling with grommets and small nails.

Organize Blocks: Purchase medium and large pizza boxes very inexpensively to store quilt blocks. They are easy to store, stack and keep organized. And, they keep your blocks neat and protected from stretching especially if they have many bias edges.



COTTON THEORY QUILTING

Another one of our market discoveries! We were so impressed with this creative "quilt first-then assemble method" that we can't wait to share it with you. From potholders and placemats to full size guilts, this is a method that you are sure to marvel at! You will love the 3 dimensional look that is created and also the fact that all of these projects are totally reversible! In class we will be making a small cardinal table runner; a great accent for the winter months. Once you have completed this project, you are ready for any of the other patterns and projects available from Cotton Theory.





Scrappy Bears Path

Marti Michell of machine quilting fame has developed great sets of templates to help rotary cut fabrics accurately and without waste. This brand new design, the Scrappy Bears Path, was unveiled at October's Quilt Market, and Natalie was lucky enough to attend her class. The "Path" comes from the combination of the Bear's Paw and Drunkard's Path blocks, all done with easy rotary cutting and machine piecing. You simply will not believe how easy this pattern is to cut and piece and how fast the top will go together. The rotary cutting templates are such a big help, but are not required to create this quilt.



Baltimore Basics

We have been so fortunate to have Gloria teach the Baltimore Album blocks from Mimi Dietrich's book, Baltimore Bouquets, but that book is now out of print. Happy to say, Mimi has finished her new book, Baltimore Basics, and Gloria will use this book as her inspiration for her upcoming class starting in February. The class will be ten sessions long, meeting once a month, to relieve any "homework anxiety" you might have about doing hand appliqué. We know you will love this new class as much as the original and we can't wait to help you get you started.





Swing Fever Jacket

We saw this jacket for the first time at Quilt Affair in the fall, and couldn't resist designing a class around it. It sews up quickly, and when made of rayon/batiks, it "swings" naturally and drapes beautifully! We bought a nice selection of gorgeous rayon batiks at market, and what a perfect project for you try them out on! We assume that you have basic garment construction skills when signing up for this class.



Take 12 Jacket

What a great design! This light weight jacket will be your favorite for the chilly Colorado nights! It is made using 12 fat quarters of your choosing and just begs to be embellished with buttons, machine or hand embroidery or some special quilting. Just let your imagination take charge!

Chrobs

Clubs continue to play an essential role in our calendar. If you are looking for a way to meet friends with similar interests, or just have a "girls night out", this might just be your answer. Each club is a little different, so there is sure to be something for everyone. We have samples from each of our clubs available, so stop in and browse. It's an easy fusible web method of appliqué which is easy, whether you choose to stitch by hand or machine. Or, if you can't decide, you can make both! Yearly Club cost of \$75.

Passport Adventure Club (formerly Embellish It)

This club will start with exploring the not boring anymore basics and expand into exceptional exotic escapades. 
Friday Afternoon Strippers (Come and Sew)

are incorporated in the quilt, as well as one of Jinny's own complimentary border prints. This class will cover the entire quilt construction over the span of six monthly classes.




Baby Quilts

Diamonds with no 'Y' seams? How can it be? With Nancy Johnson-Srebro's method, it not only is possible but actually easy! Learn this technique while making an attractive 'tree of life' block. What a wonderful wall hanging or center medallion for a king size quilt. Maybe diamonds really are a girl's best friend!





Long Arm Class

If you want to quilt those tops you have completed, are thinking of purchasing a machine for quilting, or just want to learn how a long arm works, this is a great class to take. Janet Mohler will instruct you in everything from the differences in thread to what to
