

Positive-Negative CutWork Pillow

Open a New File

- Select Create New from the Wizard or select File> New.
- Click Next in the dialog box.
- Place a dot in front of From File and click on the Browse icon.
- Select the file, ASC-00250.cmx from the *BERNINA Cutwork* Samples folder.
- Click on Open; then Next.
- Open the *Embroidery Normal* category by clicking on the +.
- Select Standard Normal from the Fabric Type and choose a background color.
- · Click Next.
- From the Color Reduction dialog box, choose Amann Isacord from the palette choices.
- · Click Finish.

Deleting Colors from the Design

- Right click on the brown color chip in the lower bar of the Thread Palette.
- Choose Select By; then Pen Color.
- Select *Delete* on the keyboard.
- Repeat for the pink color chips, leaving only the yellow color chip and the yellow outline stitches.

Viewing Hoop


- · Click on the Hoop icon.
- From the choices, select the *BERNINA 400 x 150 Mega Hoop #44.*
- Place a check mark by Rotate by 90°.
- Click OK.

Making Copies & Spacing


- Select Edit> Select All or click on Ctrl A.
- Right click and select Group.
- Click on Copy.
- · Click on Paste.
- Use the left arrow on the keyboard to move the copy away from the original to the left edge of the hoop.
- Click on *Paste* again, use the right arrow on the keyboard to move this copy to the right of the original.
- Select Edit> Select All.
- Click on Equal Horizontal Spacing icon.

Changing Colors

 Click outside the selection box around the objects to deselect the objects.



Notes:



If the hoop isn't visible; then select the View menu and make sure Hoop has a check mark.

Another way to move an object is to first select the object; then click on the outline of the object and drag it to another area of the screen. Using the keyboard arrows keeps the objects in alignment.







- Select one of the copies and change the color of the stitches by left clicking on the upper left corner of a color chip in the *Thread Palette*.
- Repeat for the other object, choosing a third color.

Combining & Breaking Apart

- Draw a selection rectangle around the object to the left.
- While it is selected, click on the Weld icon.
- Right click and select Break Apart.



Using Auto Border

- While the object is selected, click on the *Auto Border* icon.
- For Position, select To the Outside.
- For Type, select Cut.
- Click OK.
- Select the object to the far right by clicking on it. This object will not be broken apart.
- Click on the Auto Border icon.
- For Position, select *To the Outside*.
- For Type, select Cut.
- Click OK.



Deleting the Outline Stitches from the Interior

- If Sequence Manager is not open, go to View> Sequence Manager.
- Select the outline layer in Sequence Manager and hit delete.
- Select Paste to place a copy of the flower back in the center.

Editing Cutwork

- Select the objects on the left and right while holding the Ctrl kev.
- In Object Properties, place a check mark in front of Running Before.
- Change the Offset to –1 mm.
- Change the Passes to 2.

Adding a Stitched Border to Cutwork

- Place a check mark in front of Running.
- Change the Offset to 3.
- In the Styles area, select Stitch 140.
- While they are both selected, right click and choose combine.



You may scroll to find additional colors by clicking on the arrow to the right side of the Thread Palette.

Break Apart allows us to just select the outer border of the petals.

If Object Properties is not open, go to View> Toolbars> Object Properties.

Combining the cutwork will let you do all the cuts at the same time for each of the objects.





Changing the Outline Stitch Type

- Select the object in the center of the hoop.
- Select Stitch 32.

Saving & Exporting the File

- Select File> Save As.
- Create a folder called Video Mastery.
- Name the file, Lesson 1.
- Click on Save.
- Click on the Export icon.
- · Send to the machine of your choice.



Stitching the File

- Place two layers of HeavyWeight Tear Away stabilizer behind your chosen fabric.
- Starch the fabric and place on top of the stabilizer.
- Thread the machine and embroider the running before stitches around the cutwork designs.
- Prepare the machine for cutwork.
- Do Cuts 1-4, remove the cut out sections.
- Back the fabric behind the cut outs with your chosen contrast fabric and a layer of MediumWeight Tear Away.
 Place this behind the hoop.
- Stitch the remaining design.
- Sew the cut out shapes in between the designs on the pillow top, attaching them with decorative machine stitches.

To prepare the machine for cutwork:

- 1. Replace the throat plate with the cutwork plate.
- 2. Remove the upper thread.
- 3. Replace the needle with the cutwork tool, flat side toward the back.
- 4. Set the dial at Cut 1.
- 5. Replace the embroidery foot with Foot # 44.
