In keeping with our City's brand, "Beautiful Brigham City", Mayor Dennis J. Fife and the City Council are offering a City Pride Cleanup Project May 5th - May 13th. This project allows city residents to dispose of items that may be too large to put in their residential containers. Items include furniture, large boxes, debris, tires etc. NO COMMERCIAL DUMPING WILL BE ALLOWED.

The Brigham City Neighborhood Pride Council, Box Elder School District, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints are joining in this cooperative effort by supplying locations for collection and allowing residents of Brigham City to dump, free of charge, during the cleanup. Les Schwab is sponsoring the removal of tires and batteries, Jiffy Lube, Auto Zone and O'Reilly Auto Parts will accept used oil (5 gallons or less) which contain no contaminants in the oil.

Dumpster Locations:

- John Adams Parking Lot 570 East 100 North
Eagle Mountain Golf Course 967 East 700 South (Lot across the street)
Adele C. Young Intermediate School 830 South 800 West (approximately) (Vacant lot behind school, on the west side)
Brigham City LDS West Stake Center 895 North 625 West (Southwest corner)

The following items will not be accepted at the above locations:

- Tires & Batteries: must be delivered to the Brigham City Public Works Complex at 980 West Forest Street during business hours only (8:30-3:00pm). Only 4 tires will be accepted and you must have a current Brigham City Utility Bill.
Refrigerators, Metals: must be delivered to the Compost/Green Waste Facility located at 1650 West Forest Street.
Green Waste: Grass clippings, tree branches must be delivered to the Compost/Green Waste Facility at 1650 West Forest Street.
Used Oil: Less than 5 gallons can be taken to Jiffy Lube, Auto Zone or O'Reilly Auto.
Paint: Old paint can be placed in the dumpsters as long as the paint is dry. To dry the paint you can fill a paper box or box with kitty litter, sand or saw dust. Pour the remaining paint over the absorbent material. Allow to dry completely in a well-ventilated area away from children, pets, and direct heat. Dispose of the solid in the regular trash.

We hope you will take advantage of this opportunity to improve your homes & neighborhoods!

Please be prepared to show your Utah Driver's License to verify Brigham City residency.
