Request to Use Donated Funds from Civic Club

The Senior Center received \$1,000 from the Civic Club. It was requested the Council approve expenditure of these funds.

An agreement was presented between Perry and Brigham City for fire marshal inspections and plan review services.

MOTION: Councilmember Jensen made a motion to approve the Consent items as presented, seconded and carried.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentation to Blaine Packer for the 2012 Certification Tester of the Year for the Utah Fire and Rescue Academy

Mr. Buchanan came forward and stated that the firefighters in the State of Utah are managed, certified and recertified through the Utah Fire and Rescue Academy. This year Blaine Packer was recognized by the Academy for being the Certification Tester of the Year for 2012. Mr. Packer not only makes sure the Brigham City Fire Department is certified, but also travels throughout the state to provide these services.

On behalf of the Utah Fire and Rescue Academy, Mr. Buchanan presented Mr. Packer with a plaque.

Donation to Brigham City for Strategic Economic Development Plan

Mayor Fife introduced Kay Anderson, Communications Specialist, and Fred Perkins from ATK. Mr. Perkins said ATK has been in the community for over 50 years and they are proud to be part of the community. They have a vested interest in the economic health of the City and want to contribute. Mr. Perkins presented a \$10,000 check to the Mayor for the City Strategic Economic Development Plan.

SCHEDULED DELEGATION

Concerns Regarding Policy on Restrictions on Parking of Commercial Trucks and Recreational Vehicles on City Streets

Ms. Jean Cannon, Director of Transportation for the Box Elder School District, came forward. Several weeks ago one of their bus drivers received a notice on his bus for parking on the street. They have a lot of drivers that park in various places throughout the City. Requiring them to park at the District shelter would put extra miles on the buses and would add to fuel costs, which is all taxpayer's money. Based on the 21 drivers within Brigham City, they calculated this would put

on 48,600 extra miles per year on their buses. With fuel costs at \$4.02/gallon, this would be \$27,900 more in fuel. She asked the Council to consider some options on this ordinance.

Mr. Gary Knavel, District bus driver, referred to Title 15.01.050 of the City Code. It prohibits parking on any City street for more than one hour for any vehicle over 30 feet. School buses are all over 45 feet long. The title reads, "*No person shall park a commercial licensed vehicle with a load capacity greater than 21,000 pounds or any other vehicle over 30 feet in length on any City street for a period of time longer than the time reasonably necessary to load or unload the vehicle.*" He assumed that when this ordinance was considered "*or any other vehicle*" meant campers, boats, etc. He suggested "*or any other vehicle*" read "*or any other recreational vehicle.*" Another suggestion was to add "*or any other vehicle, excepting county school buses.*"

Mr. Knavel added that school buses parking on the street is temporary. They park safely away from stop signs and intersections.

Mayor Fife said the Street Department and Police Department will review this and make suggestions.

NEW BUSINESS

Proclamation Declaring May Older Americans Month

Ms. Green read the proclamation. They will have numerous activities throughout the month to celebrate. This year's theme is "Never too Old to Play."

MOTION: A motion to authorize the Mayor to sign the Older Americans Month proclamation was made by Councilmember Vincent, seconded by Councilmember Jensen and unanimously carried.

Proclamation Declaring May Building Safety Month

Mr. Tom Peterson, Building Inspector, came forward and presented a proclamation for Building Safety Month. This proclamation is a nationwide initiative to increase building safety awareness to the general public.

Discussion on Disbursement of Sycamore Wood from Trees Removed at LDS Temple Site

Mr. Pugsley approached the Council and stated that since the removal of the trees from the temple site, they have had ten requests for portions of the wood for various reasons. Nine of them are for relatively small portions of wood. He recommended the Council authorize staff to contact each of these individuals and provide them with the amount requested.

One individual has a woodworking business, Urban Forest Woodworks, and asked if he could have the wood from all the trees. He asked if the City would deliver the wood to his business in Logan. He would process the wood from all six trees, minus those given to the other individuals. In return he would use the wood from three of the trees for his own use. With the rest of the wood he would create something for the City. He would like help, either volunteer or seasonal employees to help mill the wood. The Council could decide what they want him to build.

MOTION: Councilmember Thompson moved to accept the proposal as presented, seconded by Councilmember Ericson and unanimously carried.

A motion to adjourn to a Redevelopment Agency Meeting was made by Councilmember Jensen, seconded and carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 PM.
