Please note that some utility statements may have a credit balance. We have included all the accounts in this mailing. Also note the .24 cent increase for your 1st garbage can and a .15 cent increase for each additional can. This annual increase is part of our contract with City Sanitation. The secondary water situation is getting worse because of the dry windy weather we are experiencing. Residents are using more water as compared to prior years. At the current rate of usage our secondary water will be depleted by mid-September. The Town Council strongly suggests watering only from 6-10 am and 6-10 pm. If we start conserving now, we may be able to prolong further restrictions. Thanks for your cooperation. Castle Valley Special Service District will start sweeping the streets in Cleveland soon. This is a time consuming and long process. You can assist by not parking on the street and moving your vehicles, including campers/trailers off of the road temporarily for the street sweeper.

The Town Council would like to take an opportunity to thank everyone for the hard work that goes into making your yards and gardens beautiful. Our Town looks awesome! We also wish everyone a safe summer and a great *JULY 24TH HOLIDAY*.
