




CATTAIL CREEK

Hot weather calls for cool treats. Here's a refreshing blast from the past - one of my Gramma's potluck favorites - found in the personal collection of recipes by Thelma Baldock.

PRETZEL STRAWBERRY SALAD

2 cups pretzels, coarsely crushed 34 c. butter, melted 1 c. plus 4 Tblsp. sugar, divided 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened 8 oz. Cool Whip 6 oz. pkg. strawberry Jell-O 2 c. boiling water 2 (10 oz.) pkgs frozen strawberries

Mix pretzels, butter and 4 tablespoons sugar together. Spread into a 9x13 glass dish; bake at 400° for 6 minutes.

Combine cream cheese and remaining sugar, fold in Cool Whip and spread over cooled pretzel mixture.

Dissolve Jell-O in 2 cups boiling water; stir in strawberries until gelatin starts to thicken. Pour over the cheese mixture. Regrigerate until set.
